On Sunday, September 22

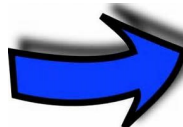

**THE CATECHISM OF THE

**The Sacrificial Memorial of
Christ and of His Body,
the Church**

1362 The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the making present and the sacramental offering of his unique sacrifice, in the liturgy of the Church which is his Body. In all the Eucharistic Prayers we find after the words of institution a prayer called the *anamnesis* or memorial.

1363 In the sense of Sacred Scripture the *memorial* is not merely the recollection of past events but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become in a certain way present and real. This is how Israel understands its liberation from Egypt: every time Passover is celebrated, the Exodus events are made present to the memory of believers so that they may conform their lives to them.

**CATECISMO DE LA
IGLESIA CATOLICA**

**El memorial sacrificial de Cristo y de su Cuerpo,
que es la Iglesia**

1362 La Eucaristía es el memorial de la Pascua de Cristo, la actualización y la ofrenda sacramental de su único sacrificio, en la liturgia de la Iglesia que es su Cuerpo. En todas las plegarias eucarísticas encontramos, tras las palabras de la institución, una oración llamada *ánamnesis* o *memorial*.

1363 En el sentido empleado por la Sagrada Escritura, el memorial no es solamente el recuerdo de los acontecimientos del pasado, sino la proclamación de las maravillas que Dios ha realizado en favor de los hombres (cf Ex 13,3). En la celebración litúrgica, estos acontecimientos se hacen, en cierta forma, presentes y actuales. De esta manera Israel entiende su liberación de Egipto: cada vez que es celebrada la pascua, los acontecimientos del Éxodo se hacen presentes a la memoria de los creyentes a fin de que conformen su vida a estos acontecimientos.

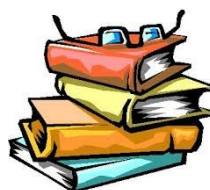

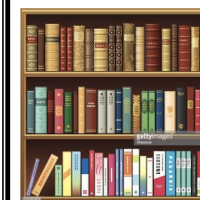
PAX CHRISTI MEETING

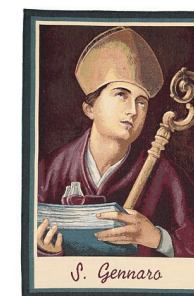
THE SHELTER NEEDS YOU!

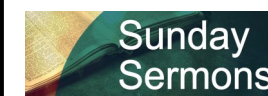
LIBRARY MINISTRY

**SAINT JANUARIUS
Feast day September 19**

Here is an interesting saint... Little is known about the life of Januarius however he is believed to have been martyred in the Emperor Diocletian's persecution of 305. Legend has it that Januarius and his companions were thrown to the bears in the amphitheater of Pozzuoli, but the animals failed to attack them. They were then beheaded, and Januarius' blood ultimately brought to Naples. "A dark mass that half fills a hermetically sealed four-inch glass container, and is preserved in a double reliquary in the Naples cathedral as the blood of St. Januarius, liquefies 18 times during the year... Various experiments have been applied, but the phenomenon eludes natural explanation..." [From the *Catholic Encyclopedia*]. It is defined Catholic doctrine that miracles can happen and are recognizable. Problems arise, however, when we must decide whether an occurrence is unexplainable, in natural terms, or merely unexplained. God is never too "scientific" to work extraordinary miracles -- especially to wake us up to the everyday miracles of sparrows and dandelions, raindrops and snowflakes. Saint Januarius is the Patron Saint of blood banks and Naples, Italy.
