28 Reasons to Fly American

Airline inaugurates 28 routes this week, including a return to St. Maarten and St. Thomas from New York and Philadelphia

FORT WORTH, Texas — American Airlines is launching 28 flights across its network this week, with more opportunities for travel throughout the U.S., the Caribbean and South America. With the launch of 12 flights to the Caribbean — including The Bahamas; Aruba; and Grand Cayman — five flights to Miami, and two new ways get to Sarasota, Florida, American is offering several reasons to trade in snow for sand.

Additionally, the airline is starting the only service between Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) and Ministro Pistarini International Airport (EZE) in Buenos Aires, Argentina; introducing a new destination with service to Oaxaca, Mexico (OAX), from Dallas Fort Worth International Airport (DFW); and resuming service to St. Thomas (STT) and St. Maarten (SXM) from Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) and John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK) in New York which had previously been suspended following Hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017.

4.9% More Passengers Are Using TUS in 2018

With one month remaining, more airline passengers have already gone through Tucson International Airport (TUS) in 2018 than in any of the years from 2013 through 2016.

Through November, passenger traffic is up 4.9% to 3,287,263.

Much of the increase can be attributed to new airlines – including the November arrivals of Allegiant and Frontier – and new routes – to Bellingham (Vancouver), Provo and Austin. All totaled nine airlines now fly nonstop to 22 destination airports.

November passengers were up 8.6% to 303,621, making it the second busiest month of the year at the airport, after March, which had 341,996 passengers.

American Airlines continues to rank as the busiest airline at TUS, followed by Southwest.
