Trusting in God's mercy, let us confess our sin.


Holy One, source of our renewal,





 When you were baptized you realized you'd heard the voice of God from the op'ning skies: "You are my beloved" out in the wilderness.



'Worship the Lord your God,




You alone are God. We praise you for the faithful departed in every age. Unite our prayers with theirs, until our wilderness journey is complete, and we rest in you. Merciful God,




COMMUNION


