

# **RAYMOND W. GREEN 1911 - 1996**

Raymond W. Green, 84 of Country Bay Village, Pigeon, died Friday, Jan. 5 after an apparent heart attack.

He was born Oct. 6, 1911 in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada, son of the late Thomas W. and Margaret (Robinson) Green. On Feb. 20, 1937, he was united in marriage to Deloris Sandham in Cass City. The couple lived in Pigeon, Caseville, Albion and Bad Axe.

Mr. Green was a member of Caseville United Methodist Church, a 1930 graduate of Bad Axe High School and attended Western State College. He was employed at Corbishley's Men's Wear and established Green's Children's Wear, both in Bad Axe. He was employed with the Vaughn Company in Albion for 12 years, retiring in 1971.

He was a past member of the Albion Exchange Club, the Cass City Summer Home Club, was past president of the Citrus Mount Estates Association in New Port Richey, Fla., and served as a board member of Country Bay Village in Pigeon. He served in the European Theatre during World War II in the U.S. Army 78th Infantry Division.

Mr. Green was a past member of the Bad Axe Rotary Club, served many years on the Bad Axe Board of Education and, together with his wife Deloris, served as co-chairman of the Bad Axe Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts.

He is survived by his wife Deloris of Pigeon; a daughter, Deborah E. Green of Bad Axe; a brother, Charles and his wife Ruth of Bad Axe; a brother-in-law Roy Briggs of St. Johns, and a nephew.

Funeral services were conducted at 11 a.m. on Monday, Jan. 8 at Caseville United Methodist Church. Rev. Gregg Mayberry officiated, with burial in the Caseville Township Cemetery.
