ORDINANCE NO. 657

An ordinance to establish and maintain a system of street lighting on Fourth Avenue from Walnut Street to Maple Street in the City of Garnett, Kansas.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of said City of Garnett, Kansas,

Section 1. That there shall be established in the city of Garnett, in accordance with plans and specifications on file with the city clerk in said City, on Fourth Avenue from Walnut Street to Maple Street a system of electric lights on poles of five light design and erected in the center of the parkway on said street, one in each end of the parkway in each block and one in the center of each of the blocks between Walnut and Elm Streets and between Elm and Vine Street, provided the cost of erecting, establishing and constructing said system shall be fully paid by popular subscription or means other than taxation therefor.

Section 2. That as said system of electric lighting provided for in section one of this ordinance shall be established, constructed and ready for operation, the said city of Garnett, shall at its own expense, operate, maintain and care for the same and that the said system shall thereafter be owned, controlled and used as other property of the said city, and that said system shall be operated as an all night service of lighting on said street, provided certain lights may be cut out from each pole at or about eleven o'clock P. M. each night.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law.
