Monica (Minnie) Grover, 92, of Homosassa, Fla., passed away Sunday, July 2, 2000, after a long illness. She was born Feb. 12, 1908, in Parisville, daughter of the late Frank and Rose (Schornack) Braiza. She was married to Ted Grover who preceded her in death.
