

NURSE(S) NEEDED!

The Georgia Lions Camp is looking for a nurse(s) to work at the camp for 6 weeks. The nurse would have private quarters, be there when the campers are there and learn from these visually impaired campers from the age of 6 and up. This is a paid position. The following are the job requirements:

- Must be a Georgia licensed RN or higher.
- Must be on-site if campers are present
- The total summer camping session for the nurse is 5 to 6 weeks
- Can be more than one nurse and they share the schedule

2. Memorial Garden

The Memorial Garden was built and dedicated to the Memory of Dr. C. M. Blanton, primary founder of the Georgia Lions Camp for The Blind. The primary purpose of the garden is to help support the Georgia Lions Camp Inc., while honoring or remembering a Lion or someone special. The fountain which is the centerpiece of the garden is surrounded by perennial, annual flowers and some shrubbery. Some of the plants are drought resistant. For those that need water on a regular basis, the garden has an irrigation system that provides water by an automated timer. The garden is surrounded by over 30,000 bricks which provide several walkways around the garden. By purchasing one of these bricks and having it engraved with a message honoring or remembering someone is how you can help support the camp and its mission. This brick will then be imbedded in a location of your choice around the Memorial Garden. There will be a ceremonial service each year held the morning of Lions Day. These engraved bricks are \$100.00 each and will be a permanent remembrance of those who believe in the mission of the Georgia Lions Camp. A single brick will be custom engraved with your message and then embedded in the garden. The maximum inscription area is 3 lines with 13 characters per line.
