Unison: We moreover engage that, when we remove from this place, we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word. And now unto Him, who brought again from the dead, Our Lord Jesus, be Power and Glory forever.

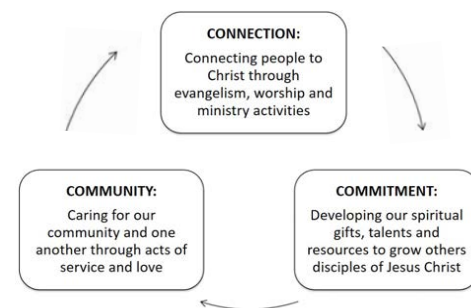

Installation of 2019 Church Officers/Leaders
