

Special 100th Anniversary Program Facts:

The Auxiliary Emergency fund was established in 1969 by the National Executive Committee, as National President Marcella Davidson, Department of New Mexico, started this as her special project. It was funded initially through a generous legacy gift from Auxiliary member Helen Colby Small of Burlington, Wisconsin. The AEF is now able to continue to grant assistance through voluntary contributions. The Auxiliary promotes awareness of the fund, disseminates information about the application process, and solicits donations from units, departments, and individual members in order to continue its availability as a resource to help members in certain dire states. A national AEF grant review committee awards AEF grants to applicants based on criteria, membership, and fund availability

In 1981, the AEF program was expanded to include a fund to help members who needed to support themselves due to unexpected life-changing circumstances such as death or illness of a spouse, divorce, or desertion. Those women found it difficult to obtain employment, and who are without the job skills necessary to obtain adequate employment. Because of this, short-term assistance can new be provided to help our members acquire marketable job skills through schooling or job training when all other sources of financial aid have been exhausted. This was called the Displaced Homemakers Fund. With the continuous generosity of our unit members, the funds allowed a wider use of the benefits to our members and it continues today. The first AEF grant amount was \$150 and today the grant amount is for \$2,400 that our members may be eligible to receive. Since the AEF Program's existence, our members have received an estimated \$5.8 million, with over \$6 million in donations from our generous members.



Education February 2021



As we all know, college is very expensive, and all of our high school students should be taking advantage of any and all scholarships available to them. Units and departments are responsible for promoting American Legion Auxiliary scholarships and making sure the schools have them in ample time for students to apply. The American Legion Auxiliary offers four scholarship opportunities to students:

- 1. Children of Warriors National Presidents Scholarship: Scholarship is awarded to children of veterans who served in the armed forces during eligibility dates for The American Legion. Three \$5,000 scholarships will be awarded in each division. Fifteen outstanding students will be awarded a total of \$75,000 to further their education. The applicant must complete 50 hours of community service during their high school years to be eligible for one of these scholarships. Applicants must present the completed application to the local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President on or before March 1, 2021 to be forwarded to the Department Secretary by March 15, 2021.
- 2. **The Non-Traditional Student Scholarship**: One scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded in each American Legion Auxiliary division. Applicant must be a member of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion and shall have paid dues for the two preceding years and for the calendar year in which the application is made. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2021 to be forwarded to the **Department Secretary by March 15, 2021.**
- 3. **Spirit of Youth Scholarship**: One Junior member in each division will receive a scholarship valued at \$5,000. The applicant must have held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the immediate past three years, hold a current membership card and continue her membership in the American Legion Auxiliary during the four-year scholarship period. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2021 to be forwarded to the **Department Secretary by March 15, 2021.**
- 4. Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship: American Legion Auxiliary Junior members are the future of our organization. To reward those who retain their membership into adulthood, the American Legion Auxiliary offers the Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship to current college students. Ten scholarships, in the amount of \$2,500 each, will be awarded to a current college student for 2020. Two scholarships will be awarded in each division of the American Legion Auxiliary. The scholarship is a grant; not a loan. Applicant must present the completed application to the American Legion Auxiliary unit president on or before March 1, 2021 to be forwarded to the Department Secretary by March 15, 2021.

Please promote these American Legion Auxiliary scholarships to enable our children of veterans to apply and receive funds the American Legion Auxiliary has so graciously provided. Applications are available online at www.ALAforVeterans.org/Scholarships.

Legislative

February 2021

Greetings,

I hope this finds all of you in good health and spirits. This is a very trying time for all of us. Many may feel lost or not quite knowing how we all fit right now. Many are struggling with finances. I really don't know what to say.

First off, I would like to apologize for not having a bulletin last month. Right before Christmas and over Christmas I was very ill with bilateral pneumonia. Fortunately, it wasn't COVID. I am feeling much better now and back to work. On that note, I hope everyone had a great and healthy holiday season and happy new year!

As many of you know the Governor and President, are still giving daily briefings on the COVID-19 pandemic. Arizona is spiking again very rapidly. There are two vaccines approved by the FDA, by Pfizer and Moderna. Johnson and Johnson are also jumping aboard and working on getting a one dose vaccine approved by the FDA, as opposed to the two dose ones available now.

Your Mid-Year Reports were due to me by December 1st. I only received two reports from Units 1 and 66. I did complete my report to National with the information I was given. I believe the lack of reporting is due to the COVID pandemic.

The Presidential Inauguration of Joe Biden was held on January 20th. Washington DC as well as State Capitols including ours has been the site of demonstrations, some turning violent as our Nation's Capitol was stormed. Five people died, including two US Capitol Police Officers in the DC incident. Fortunately, the activities at our State Capitol as of the writing of this bulletin have not turned violent. This is coming from an in person view. Arizona Department of Public Safety has deployed more Troopers to Capitol as well as the Department of Administration erecting two fences encompassing the entire block the Capitol Complex sits on. More demonstrations are expected during the Presidential transition period. The good news is that arrests have been made. On January 3rd, the 117th Congress was convened. On January 11th, the State Legislature convened. On January 13th, the US House of Representatives voted on a second impeachment of President Donald Trump. The vote passed. Senate President Mike Pence stated that he would not go forth on a second impeachment.

In closing, please stay healthy and positive. Remember, we are all in this together. Please remember, to be kind and patient with one another. I miss you all and care deeply about you and hope to see you soon. If there is anything you need to talk about, call or email me. I am but a few clicks away.

Who needs to hear from you:

VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 121-31-20

All events are suspended until further notice. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Southwest Bind Rehabilitation Center is now accepting a limited number of new patients. They have requested that service organizations provide delivery of in house meals. There will be no volunteers at these meals. There is NO visitation at SAVAHCS. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time. American Legion Auxiliary Gift Shop will have to be done differently this year. The hospital is asking for lists from nursing staff of items needed by Veteran patients. They have requested that all service organizations work together to fill these needs with no duplication. American Legion Auxiliary Christmas Gift Shop donated \$4,000.00 worth of gift cards in support this effort.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 is \$800.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for February 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 is \$37,984.33. This amount includes the Christmas Gift Shop donation for 2019. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 24, Unit 66, Unit 68 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Four registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 is 386.5. S AVAHCS is in the process of bringing back volunteers. Volunteers will be phased in as needed and the process will be closely monitored by the Director. Volunteers will be contacted by the Voluntary Service office as their services are needed. One more Auxiliary volunteer has been called back. This effort is on hold due to spike in COVID-19 cases in recent weeks.
