You can register from the ABWA membership portal, National Events Calendar. You can also register by calling the ABWA National Office at 913-732-5100, Monday through Thursday, 8:00-5:00pm. When you register, you will choose between paying in full at the time of registration or paying half down at registration and the balance any time before August 1st. Keep in mind that if you don't pay the balance by August 1, you will forfeit your down payment.

Also, don't forget to reserve your hotel room by calling the Westin Portland Harborview, Monday through Friday at 207-517-8822. Be sure to tell them you are with the ABWA National Conference to get the \$199.00 per night room rate. The deadline for this rate is October 6, 2025, but don't wait too long!
