Prayer of Confession

P: Let us pray... Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love You and worthily magnify Your holy name, empowered by Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Listen to the Voice of God in a Great Storm (responsive reading) A Psalm of David.

- ¹Ascribe to the LORD, O heavenly beings, (Heb. sons of gods) ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
- ² Ascribe to the LORD the glory of His name; worship the LORD in holy splendor.
- ${}^{3}\text{The voice}$ of the LORD is over the waters; the God of glory thunders,
- the voice of the LORD is over mighty waters.
- ⁴The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is full of majesty.
- ⁵The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars; the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon.
- ⁶He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox.
- ⁷The voice of the LORD flashes forth flames of fire.⁸**The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness; the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh**. (Kadesh is the Israelite camp near Mount Sinai, where they had been camped for nearly a year, before possessing the Promised Land according to Numbers 10:11-14:45)

FIRST LESSON: Genesis 1:1-5 Six Days of Creation and the Sabbath

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind (*ruha the breath*) from God, (*like a mighty wind*) swept over the face of the waters.

³Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

SECOND LESSON: Acts 19:1-7 Paul in Ephesus

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit."

³Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?"

They answered, "Into John's baptism."

⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized **in the name** of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied— ⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.

THE GOSPEL: Mark 1:4-11

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. 5 And people

from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. Have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."
