DESCRIPTION

Uncovering suicidal ideation, planning, actions and intent is one of the most daunting and critical of all challenges for mental health providers and substance abuse counselors. This two-part presentation (as has appeared on the Zero Suicide Care Training Options List) provides a rare opportunity for participants to hear and see the strategies and nuances of the **Chronological Assessment of Suicide Events** (CASE Approach) as delineated and demonstrated by its innovator, Shawn Christopher Shea MD.

In this half-day training, Dr. Shea, one of the most popular speakers in mental health today, will provide a compelling two-part presentation (with video demonstrations). In the first session, Dr. Shea will delineate and demonstrate seven different interviewing techniques for uncovering the types of hidden secrets - such as incest, domestic violence, marital stress, financial stress, antisocial behaviors and substance abuse - that set the stage for suicide. In the second session, he will then demonstrate how to flexibly interweave these validity techniques into the highly acclaimed interviewing strategy for rapidly uncovering suicidal ideation and planning through the CASE Approach.

OBJECTIVES

- · Be able to understand and describe the difficult roadblocks to uncovering a client's true suicidal intent - and his or her method of choice for suicide as delineated by the Equation of Suicidal Intent.
- Be able to describe and utilize the following seven validity techniques (normalization, shame attenuation, the behavioral incident, gentle assumption, denial of the specific, the catch-all question and symptom amplification) that are useful for uncovering both suicidal ideation and the types of sensitive and taboo topics that trigger such ideation.
- Be able to flexibly and sensitively utilize the above validity techniques for eliciting suicidal ideation using the CASE Approach, with an emphasis on spotting clients with immediate and imminent risk of suicide

Dr. Shea is an internationally acclaimed workshop leader and innovator in the fields of suicide prevention, clinical interviewing and creating resiliency having given over 850 presentations worldwide. He has presented numerous times at venues such as the Cape Cod Symposium, the Santa Fe Symposium, the Psychiatric Congress, and the Annual Meetings of both the American Association of Suicidology and the American Psychiatric Association. Dr. Shea's book, The Practical Art of Suicide Assessment, is viewed as a classic in the field of suicidology. His text, Psychiatric Interviewing: The Art of Understanding, 3rd Edition, was chosen by the British Medical Association as the 2017 Book of the Year in Psychiatry. Dr. Shea is the Director of the Training Institute for Suicide Assessment and Clinical Interviewing (https://suicideassessment.com/), a training and consultation service providing workshops, consultations and quality assurance design in mental health assessments. He is also in private practice.
