Father Sam's Corner
28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

You are invited to the heavenly Feast. Don't miss it!

This Sunday's first reading and Gospel give us the picture of how we shall live in heaven. In the first reading Isaiah describes heaven as a mountainous place where God prepares "a feast of juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines," for all peoples (Isaiah 25:6). Also, in today's Gospel Christ pictured our life in the kingdom in the parable of a wedding feast prepared by a king for his son. According to this parable the king, after preparing the food of the feast with meats from calves, fattened cattle, and every good thing you can imagine, invited all peoples to enjoy. The king in this parable is God and the wedding feast represents the celebration of eternal joy in the kingdom of God. Thus, both the first reading and the Gospel give an image of the heavenly joy that is going to surpass all our expectations. The happiness waiting for us in heaven is going to be more wonderful than we can imagine. Jesus used the wedding feast to help us have a glimpse of the joy of heaven. But in the first reading Isaiah showed us the heavenly feast will be more wonderful than the earthly wedding feast. For instance, an earthly wedding ceremony could be interrupted or marred by lack of material things, like the wedding in Cana where the joy of the celebration was interrupted by lack of enough wine (John 2:3-5). Also, I was in a wedding ceremony when sad news of the passing on of the bride's relative changed the entire mood of the occasion. Unlike the above instances, Isaiah told us in the first reading that in the heavenly banquet there is no sickness, death, no worry for lack of material things, and no grief. "For on this mountain (in this heavenly feast), the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces...On that day it will be said: this is the Lord for whom we looked; let us rejoice and be glad that He has saved us!" (Isaiah 25:6-9).

Although the stories in both the first reading and Gospel show the heavenly banquet is for all people, the Gospel parable shows the sequence in the invitation and people's responses to the invitation. Consequently, the sequence in the Gospel can be likened to times people from different parts of the world receive the Gospel or the word of God. Those who ignored the invitation in the parable can be said to be some whose too much attachment and love of the material things have caused them to pay little or no attention to their spiritual life. Whereas those invitees who "laid hold of the servants of the king, maltreated and killed them" are those who killed the prophets, Son of God and His servants. Then the person found in the hall without the wedding garment can be said to represent those who will not be spiritually ready at the second coming of the Son of God. Perhaps Christ might have noticed the above attitudes in the lives of some people in his audience that he warned them: "Many are invited, but few are chosen" (Matthew 22:14). By the virtue of our baptism we are both invited to the feast and called to invite others to the banquet of the kingdom of God. Also, all of us are already invited to participate in the joy of the kingdom of God through our baptism. Let us not allow anything to make us miss it.

Father Sam's Corner

Vigésimo Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Evangelio: Mateo 22:1-14

Estáis invitados al Banquete celestial. ¡No te lo pierdas!

La primera lectura y el Evangelio de este domingo nos dan una idea de cómo viviremos en el cielo. En la primera lectura, Isaías describe el cielo como un lugar montañoso donde Dios prepara “un banquete de manjares jugosos y ricos y de vinos puros y escogidos” para todos los pueblos (Isaías 25:6). Además, en el Evangelio de hoy Cristo describió nuestra vida en el reino en la parábola de un banquete de bodas preparado por un rey para su hijo. Según esta parábola el rey, después de preparar la comida de la fiesta con carnes de terneros, ganado engordado y todo lo bueno que puedas imaginar, invitó a todos los pueblos a disfrutar. El rey en esta parábola es Dios y el banquete de bodas representa la celebración del gozo eterno en el reino de Dios. Así, tanto la primera lectura como el Evangelio dan una imagen del gozo celestial que va a superar todas nuestras expectativas. La felicidad que nos espera en el cielo será más maravillosa de lo que podemos imaginar. Jesús usó el banquete de bodas para ayudarnos a vislumbrar el gozo del cielo. Pero en la primera lectura Isaías nos mostró que el banquete celestial será más maravilloso que el banquete de bodas terrenal. Por ejemplo, una ceremonia de boda terrenal podría verse interrumpida o estropeada por la falta de cosas materiales, como la boda en Caná donde el gozo de la celebración fue interrumpido por la falta de suficiente vino (Juan 2:3-5). Además, estaba en una ceremonia de boda cuando la triste noticia del fallecimiento de un familiar de la novia cambió todo el ambiente de la ocasión. A diferencia de los casos anteriores, Isaías nos dijo en la primera lectura que en el banquete celestial no hay enfermedad, ni muerte, ni preocupación por la falta de cosas materiales, ni dolor. “Porque en este monte (en esta fiesta celestial), el Señor Dios enjugará las lágrimas de todos los rostros... En aquel día se dirá: Éste es el Señor a quien esperábamos. ¡Alegrémonos y gocemos de que Él nos haya salvado! (Isaías 25:6-9).

Aunque las historias tanto de la primera lectura como del Evangelio muestran que el banquete celestial es para todas las personas, la parábola del Evangelio muestra la secuencia en la invitación y las respuestas de las personas a la invitación. En consecuencia, la secuencia del Evangelio puede compararse con las ocasiones en que personas de diferentes partes del mundo reciben el Evangelio o la palabra de Dios. Se puede decir que aquellos que ignoraron la invitación de la parábola son aquellos cuyo demasiado apego y amor por las cosas materiales les ha hecho prestar poca o ninguna atención a su vida espiritual. Mientras que aquellos invitados que “agarraron a los siervos del rey, los maltrataron y los mataron” son los que mataron a los profetas, Hijo de Dios y a sus siervos. Entonces se puede decir que la persona encontrada en el salón sin el traje de bodas representa a aquellos que no estarán preparados espiritualmente para la segunda venida del Hijo de Dios. Quizás Cristo pudo haber notado las actitudes anteriores en la vida de algunas personas de su audiencia y les advirtió: “Muchos son los invitados, pero pocos los escogidos” (Mateo 22:14). En virtud de nuestro bautismo estamos invitados a la fiesta y llamados a invitar a otros al banquete del reino de Dios. Además, todos nosotros ya estamos invitados a participar del gozo del reino de Dios a través de nuestro bautismo. No permitamos que nada nos haga perderlo.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today I am announcing a special *Called by Name* campaign to help identify faithful young men and women in our diocese who could be future leaders in our Church.

As you know, our diocese has a great need for "more workers for the harvest." Not only do we need more Priests and Sisters, but also faithful lay disciples who will serve as leaders in our parishes. We need the entire Church to identify these future leaders so that we can offer support and encouragement as they encounter Christ and discern their vocations. For a young person, the correct discernment of their vocation may be the most important decision they make in their entire life!

Called by Name Sunday will take place on the weekend of October 21/22, 2023. On this day, I am asking for two things:

1) For Young People

For those of you discerning your life's vocation, be open to God's call to the priesthood or religious life. God's calling is a beautiful gift – be courageous and open to His call! Jesus came that we might have life and have it to the full. Do not be afraid. If God is calling you to the priesthood or religious life, then nothing less will satisfy you and He will give you the grace to live that life with great joy!

2) For All Parishioners

I invite you to think deeply about the youth and young adults in your parish who you believe could be faithful leaders in the Catholic Church of the Diocese of Savannah. These young people do not necessarily need to desire to become Priests or Sisters; we also need leaders in the vocation of marriage. They need to desire Jesus Christ! They need to desire to bring others to Him.

Please submit the names of at least one (but hopefully several!) faithful young people you know. You can use the envelope provided at Mass or online at savannahvocations.org. If you submit the name of a person under age 18, please include the names of his or her parents.

This initiative is near to my heart, and I ask you to please participate thoughtfully so that it will bear much fruit throughout the diocese. I also ask you to join me in praying that the Lord will raise up many new leaders for the future of the Church!
