### **Sunday Reflection: Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Jesus chooses seventy-two of his followers and sends them out in pairs to every town and place he plans to visit. He gives them clear instructions: carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; greet no one on the road. Why seventy-two? This number shows that Jesus wanted to reach every corner of the world. In Jewish tradition, seventy-two represented all nations. By sending this many, Jesus was telling us that God's love and good news are meant for

everyone, everywhere. Jesus sent them two by two, reminding us that mission is not a solo journey. We need support and companionship. When we share faith, face challenges, or carry a difficult message, having someone beside us gives strength and hope. The pairs also show that we are part of a community; the Church is built on relationships, encouragement, and shared work.

Jesus tells them to rely on the hospitality of those they meet—to eat and drink what is offered, heal the sick in that home, and say, "Peace to this house." They are to bring God's peace and healing, not their own plans or worries. This teaches us to trust God's provision and to focus on our spiritual task, not on our comforts. If a town rejects them, they are to shake the dust from their feet and move on. We learn that not everyone will welcome our message. Yet, we continue without bitterness, knowing that our mission is to offer God's love, not to force acceptance. Let us remember this call today: to share God's peace and healing with everyone, to work together in faith, and to trust that God provides all we need.

### Saint of the Week ... St. Maria Goretti

Maria was born in Italy in 1890. As the daughter of a poor tenant farmer, she had no chance to go to school and never learned to read or write. On a hot afternoon in July, Maria was sitting at the top of the stairs of her house, mending a shirt. She was not quite 12 years old, but physically mature. A cart stopped outside and a neighbor, 18-year-old Alessandro, ran up the stairs. He seized her and pulled her into a bedroom. She struggled and tried to call for help. "No, God does not wish it," she cried out. "It is a sin. You would go to hell for it." Alessandro began striking her with a dagger.

Maria was taken to a hospital. Her last hours were marked by her simple compassion of the good—concern about where her mother would sleep, forgiveness of her attacker, and her devout welcoming of her last Holy Communion. She died about 24 hours after the attack.

Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison. For a long time he was unrepentant and surly, until one night he dreamt of Maria gathering flowers and offering them to him. His life changed. When he was released after 27 years, his first act was to beg the forgiveness of Maria's mother.

Devotion to Maria grew, miracles were worked, and in less than half a century she became the youngest saint to be canonized. At her beatification in 1947, her 82-year-old mother, two sisters, and her brother appeared with Pope Pius XII on the balcony of St. Peter's. Three years later at Maria's canonization, a 66-year-old Alessandro knelt among the crowd in attendance and cried tears of joy.

St. Maria Goretti's feast day is celebrated on July 6, the date of her death. She is the patron saint of chastity, teenage girls, poverty, purity and forgiveness.

### **Mission Collection Set For Next Weekend**

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has an annual program which allows pre-assigned missions to visit parishes throughout the state to help support their important programs.

This year, our parish's mission appeal will support the Diocese of Kumbakonam, India and its mission activities. We will welcome Fr. John Kennedy at both Masses next weekend. Fr. Kennedy has visited our parish many times in the past.

The Diocese of Kumbakonam was founded in 1899 and covers an area nearly 8000 square kilometers with a Catholic population of 213,000.

Their most pressing missionary needs include:

- Establishing additional parishes. Many large missions need to become independent parishes with a resident priest for better pastoral ministry.
- Providing better facilities and supplies to the 136 Catholic schools and 22 orphanages.
- Enabling nuns and Catholic teachers to better serve the children and adults, particularly the poor and marginalized.
- Supporting the diocesan hospitals, rural medical clinics, and other healthcare facilities.
- Educating more young men in the seminary who leave their homes to serve in many other countries as priests and missionaries.
- Educating nearly 5,000 poor or orphaned children, along with providing them with safe shelter and food.

All of these projects depend almost solely on donations from this Mission program. Please prayerfully consider a donation next weekend to assist these brothers and sisters in Christ and the important work the Diocese of Kumbakonam is doing.
