As the sun starts to set on the summer dart leagues, it's time to take a reflective look back over the past couple of months to see just how this haphazard band of misfits and renegades has been able to put together thier most winning season ever.

Player/manager Ted "too long" Borgert says "I think what makes us work is that we are a team of extremes. We have the oldest guy, the best dressed, and we are definitely the highest team on the circuit today. When we stand on each others shoulders to hit the D20, we soar to over 24 feet, not bad for a team with only four active players. We'd be a lot higher but we have a token short guy so that brings down our average a bit.

Jerry "golden viking" Tansky, self proclaimed oldest guy says, "the PENETRATERS like to make it hard on the competition," and hard, Jerry makes it. To date Jerry has 97 wins and only 35 losses for an average of 72%. The second half of the summer ol' Jer is approaching maximum penetration tossing a blistering 83%

"Magic" Mark Needles is the teams most potent darter with 108 wins and 32 losses for an average of 78%. Most of Mark's teammates call him mr. best dressed because all

Dressed or not Mark is a power house, so far this summer he has hurled 15 shots over 120, six in one night with one being a 180.

"I've had to learn the game on my own," says Ted, "my parents never threw darts, I had to sneak out at night because in those days darts were considered the devils game." Today Ted has a healthy 70% average with 101 wins and 43 losses.

Rounding out the team Gary "wild man" Foley, the token short guy. While only standing 7" tall Gary provides the clutch shots. His average is a respectable 62% with 82 wins and 50 losses.

The PENETRATERS will be appearing live, for one night only, August 7, at Hanks. They will be attempting to smoke Hanks Joints."The JOINTS are are stiffest competition. With Bill O'brian, Tim Luehrs, Dan Kruezer, Marc Simmons and Kim Druhn providing the power, it should be a close match".

Spaces are limited so if you would like to reserve a space on the bus and/or a room please contact the DART TRAIN at 233-0407 as soon as possible.

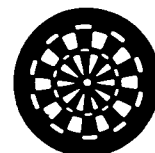
"We are looking forward to really fun weekend and we hope you will join us, but we must receive full payment of the deposits by Thursday August 15th."

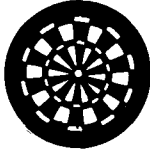

It has become apparent that some players feel that they may play on two different teams during the season- Wed. & Thurs. People have told me that they think these are two different leagues. This is not so! Both Wed. and Thur. nights are the same league.

Thursday was the DDA's original night of play. When the novice teams were formed several

ago, they played on Wednesday. We have very few novice teams in our leagues anymore. Those once novice teams are now seasoned professionals. As more and more teams (113 last year) stay in and new ones enter into, we need this extra day to accomodate all the darters.

Another reason is that with most of our sponsoring pubs playing the maximum number of teams allowed at thier bar, (regulated by the number of boards) it becomes almost impossible to allow the practice of playing on two different teams on two different nights.

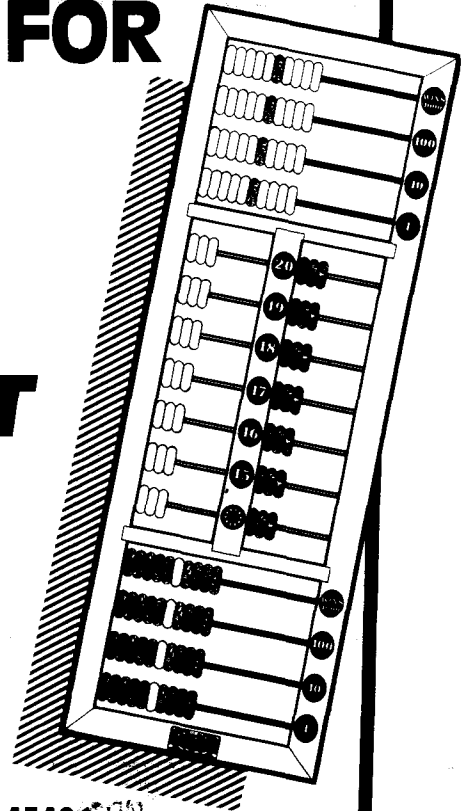

## DARTING WORKSHOP

The second annual Bull's-Eye News Darters Workshop was held Friday, May 31st prior to the Lucky Lights Spectacular in Columbus. As last year some of the top professional darters of the U.S. conducted a workshop. This year these players consisted of Nicky Virachkul, Sandy Reitan-Green, Conrad Daniels, Judy Campbell and Cincinnati's Tony Payne.

The morning session started with the panel of professionals covering topics such as strategies of '01 and cricket, the mechanics of throwing a dart, mental aspects of the sport and fatigue. Questions and discussion were encouraged.

After this session was completed, each pro was assigned several boards and we were allowed to join any or all of them to seek assistance or advice on a one to one basis. This was a pleasant change from last year's workshop as we were assigned the pro we were to spend our time with. I took the liberty to visit each pro and sample some of their techniques and advice. Each of these superstars were more than pleased to offer assistance to each person seeking advice.

When the morning session concluded, a luncheon was served. Seating was assigned and I found myself enjoying dinner with Nicky Virachkul, Judy Campbell, the Vice-President of Central Ohio Darters, the Vice-President of the Savannah, Georgia darting association and several dart shop owners. Naturally, discussions during dinner concerned darts.

After lunch, Bull's-Eye News writers Janet Searcy and Howie Reed spoke to our group about various topics. Howie Reed also writes for the ADD's Double Eagle and proved to be most entertaining in person.

Following a presentation by Triple 20 Productions we were furnished a keg of beer and allowed to once again mingle with the attending pros. I personally found listening to Tony Payne's and Conrad Daniels' differing strategies of cricket entertaining.

This workshop was better than last year's in that we were able to spend our time with whom we wanted. I feel the fee of \$25.00 to be very reasonable.

I found myself the only player from Dayton in attendance again this year. I have played darts for 10 years and consider myself knowledgeable of the sport and yet I have picked up several tips at these workshops as well as had one heck of a good time. I hope next year more Dayton darters take advantage of this workshop as I think you'll find it an enjoyable experience.
