

Lake Shadows Pool Rules and Information

Welcome to Lake Shadows Pool! We want all our families to have an enjoyable experience this summer. This document will answer some of your questions as well as outline the pool rules. Please discuss these rules with your children so that we can have a safe and fun swimming season.

The Lake Shadows Pool is meant to be used by all property owners who are current on all HOA dues. By paying your dues or guest passes, you are helping to pay for the expense, maintenance and upkeep of the pool. It's very expensive to operate the pool, so every little bit helps...we thank you for your support!

The pool tag is included in the Community Service Fee, you must have all dues paid and in good standing to receive a pool tag. You may receive a pool tag for the immediate family of the homeowner. This will include the homeowner, spouse and children who live at the residence. A grandparent can also receive tags for their grandchildren. Adult children living in the same residence as the property owner must show ID with the address of the residence in Lake Shadows. Families who rent homes in Lake Shadows can receive tags for their family with approval from the property owner (property owner must sign pool tag form) as long as the owner of their property is up to date on their dues. The pool tag application must be filled out, you can access the online application at www.lakeshadows.org under the forms area. Once it is submitted and approved you will allow to pick them up from the Pool Manager/ Supervisor or lifeguard once the pool has opened for the season. You must bring your photo id with your address on to receive your pool tags. You will be asked to sign the pool tag form once you pick them up.

If you prefer not to receive a seasonal pool pass you may swim for a daily fee of \$5.00 per day. The same rules will apply; all your HOA dues must be current. You may also purchase a guest pass for your family or friends that are visiting you for the day and would like to spend time at the pool. The property owner must ALWAYS be present with their guests. Guest fees must be paid in cash, credit card or from a check written by the property owner, no checks will be accepted from a renter or non-property owner. No exceptions! All guests not monitoring children will be required to pay \$5.00 per day entrance fee.

The pool opening for 2025 is going to be delayed, then weekends only until school is out. Afterwards, the pool hours will be Tuesday-Saturday 1-7 and Sunday 1-6. The pool is closed on Mondays for maintenance. **If you are interested in a pool party**, you must contact the pool manager for information. The pool can only be reserved during non-operating hours (between the hours of 9am-1pm then 7:00pm-8:30pm Friday & Saturday, 9am-1pm then 7pm-8:30pm Tuesday-Thursday & Sunday 9am-1pm *no Sunday evening rentals due to having to put in chemicals*) but never on Mondays.

The monitors/lifeguards will have complete authority at the pool. If you do not want to follow their direction, then you must leave the pool area. If you wish to discuss the matter further with the pool manager, you may do so at another time, but at that moment, the monitor/lifeguard has the authority. Any person posing severe danger to themselves or others will be asked to leave the pool area immediately. For not following the rules, the monitor/lifeguard is authorized to put the person in "time out", sitting at a distance from the pool for 15 minutes. A second offense that day will result in the person being expelled from the pool for the day. In order to re-enter the pool, the person or parent of the person under 18 will need to have a conference with the pool manager to try to resolve the issue. If a person has been expelled from the pool for a severe infraction of the rules, he will need to address the LSCL Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting before having access to the pool again.

Children must be 12 years old or older by June 1st to swim without an adult's supervision. In order to supervise a child 11 or under, the person must be 18 years old or older by June 1st. All toddlers must be potty trained or wear a "little swimmer". The same water and filter system is used for both the wading and large pool, so this is an important health issue.

POOL RULES

YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW YOUR POOL TAGS WHEN SIGNING IN – IF YOU DO NOT HAVE YOUR TAG – YOU WILL BE ASKED TO GO HOME AND GET IT – NO EXECPTIONS

NO ALCOHOL

NO EATING OR DRINKING IN POOL

NO GLASS CONTAINERS

NO RUNNING

NO HORSEPLAY

NO LOUD MUSIC

NO PROFANITY

NO WATER “BLASTERS”

NO INFLATABLES WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SWIM AIDS FOR THE YOUNG CHILDREN

NO “NOODLES”

NO PETS

NO SMOKING IN POOL OR DECK AREA – SMOKING ALLOWED IN GRASSY AREA ONLY

ABSOLUTELY NO UNDERAGE SMOKING

A SWIM TEST MUST BE COMPLETED TO ENTER THE DIVING AREA

ONE AT A TIME ON THE DIVING BOARD, OBEY ALL RULES ON THE BOARD

PICK UP ALL TRASH WHEN LEAVING

WHEN GOING INTO THE LAKE, A SHOWER AND CHANGE OF CLOTHES ARE REQUIRED TO RE-ENTER POOL
