# HOUGHS NECK GARDEN CLUB

This summer turned out to be a gardener's nightmare but as soon temperatures let up just a little Houghs Neck Garden Club members could be seen tidying up at the Welcome Rock and elsewhere. And word of HNGC's contributions to the beautification of our neighborhood has spread beyond Houghs Neck. We did not mention in our last Bulletin article that the Houghs Neck Garden Club was honored at its Tenth Anniversary Celebration on June 18th when State Representative Tackey Chan presented the Club with a Certificate from the Massachusetts House of Representatives to congratulate the Club on its tenth anniversary and in recognition of services to the Houghs Neck community.

The HNGC has two programs coming up in the near future. On October 5th, the Club's first speaker for the fall, Thomas Mickey, will speak on America's Romance with the English Garden. Mickey, who has been a garden columnist for the Quincy Patriot Ledger, is a Master Gardener and Professor Emeritus of Communication Studies at Bridgewater State University, and is a graduate of the Landscape Institute at the Boston Architectural College.

On November 2nd, the Club welcomes Norman Smith, who will speak about Birds of Prey. Smith is the Director of the Blue Hills Trailside Museum and the Norman Smith Environmental Education Center in Milton, MA. He has worked for the Massachusetts Audubon Society since 1974. During his studies, which span over 35 years, Smith has rehabilitated injured birds and triumphantly fostered over 1,000 orphaned owl and hawk chicks into adoptive nests.

Both meetings will be held in the MWRA Community Room at Nut Island, 2nd floor, 149 Sea Street, starting at 7pm with refreshments and a brief business meeting followed by the program at 7:30pm. New members are welcome!





Last month I hosted the neighborhood meeting regarding K&R Auto Body as they have applied to the City License Board to increase the number of vehicles allowed on their property and extend their hours of operation. The matter had been slated for a September License Board meeting but had been continued until October 4th. I will provide an update on the outcome in my next article. I also wrote about chronic blighted properties last month. I am pleased to report a demolition permit has been issued to the homeowner of 45 Shennen Street and am hopeful that structure will finally come down this month. The City has also been a culprit and I have been advocating for the demolition of the old yellow cottage on Freca Road since I took office. This was a property that the city acquired as a result of tax deficiency and has been an eyesore and detriment to

the neighborhood ever since. I want to thank Mayor Koch for his efforts in securing funding and we expect this property to be demolished this month as well. I will be hosting two community meetings this month with the Quincy Police Crime Prevention Unit to discuss the importance of residents' participation in "see something, say something" concept, ways for you to communicate with the Quincy Police Department and to hear your concerns and comments about crime issues and police matters in your neighborhood and the Ward 1 community. By working together with the Police Department to address and resolve issues, we can enhance the quality of life in our community. Lt. Dan Minton, who heads the Crime Prevention Unit, has dedicated a page on the Department's website <http://quincypolice.org/crime-prevention>, with information and updates for residents. ### Register O'Donnell Promotes Protection Against Real Estate Fraud

Continuing his efforts to protect homeowners against dishonest individuals, Register of Deeds William P. O'Donnell reminds residents about the availability of a free on-line Consumer Notification Service offered by the Registry to protect Norfolk County property owners against fraud.

"The F.B.I. has reported that property and mortgage fraud is one of the fastest growing white collar crimes in the United States. Multiple jurisdictions across the country have reported individuals recording fraudulent documents and making it appear like they own another person's home or property. While we have been fortunate that this problem has not revealed itself here in Norfolk County, I want to make sure my office is proactively and vigorously protecting consumers," noted Register O'Donnell.

Any owner of real property in the twenty-eight communities comprising Norfolk County can sign-up for the Consumer Notification Service free of charge by doing the following: Go to the Registry's website, [www.norfolkdeeds.org](http://www.norfolkdeeds.org), and click on the Consumer Notification Service Get Consumer Alerts button to complete the initial registration. From there, follow the remaining sign-up instructions.

Once you have signed up for the service, each subscriber will be able to input two names, individual or business, and the corresponding city or town in Norfolk County for monitoring. They can monitor their real estate for such activities as changes in deeds, mortgages, non-mortgage liens, Homesteads or other land documents that might be recorded against the property.

If a document is recorded against one of the names inputted for monitoring, the subscriber will be alerted via email, usually within 24 hours. The person can check the Registry's on-line land research records at [www.norfolkresearch.org](http://www.norfolkresearch.org) as an option. If a subscriber believes a fraudulent land record has been recorded against their property, they should then immediately contact the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds Customer Service Center at (781) 461-6101. The subscriber will also be given a list of public safety referrals by the Registry.

Register O'Donnell concluded, "As your Norfolk County Register of Deeds, I take very seriously the Registry's responsibility to provide secure, accurate and accessible land records for all Norfolk County communities. I also want to be proactive in ensuring that there is no fraudulent activity related to land document recordings."

I hope you and your family had a happy and safe Labor Day weekend. The weather was wonderful and I enjoyed speaking with people at Chowdafest—many thanks to all the volunteers and participants for making it another great day!

The Governor signed a pay equity bill into law on August 1st. The new law prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender in the payment of wages for comparable work unless the difference is based on a qualifying factor including seniority (provided that paternal, family and medical leave don't reduce seniority); a system that measures earnings by quantity or quality of production, sales, or revenue; education, training or experience. The law does not prevent employers from implementing performance-based compensation but it does prevent employers from reducing salaries of (fellow) employees in order to comply with the law.

Employers are also prevented from requesting a job candidate's salary history, a measure designed to end the self-perpetuating cycle of wage disparity. Massachusetts would be the first state in the nation to adopt such a provision. However, prospective employees would not be barred from voluntarily disclosing their past salaries and employees are allowed to talk about their salaries with each other.

An employer can prevent lawsuits under this law by completing a self-evaluation of its pay practices over a three year period. The employer must demonstrate reasonable progress

in eliminating pay disparities and ultimately establish and implement a system where there are no pay inequities between men and women. The law goes into effect on July 1, 2018, to give businesses time to implement new procedures to ensure that men and women receive equitable compensation for comparable work.

The Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles has released The Parent's Supervised Driving Program (PSDP), a guidebook designed to assist parents of new drivers. The PSDP has information and lessons on driving basics, parental pointers and licensing qualifications that are helpful to parents/guardians of new drivers. Parents/guardians of learner's permit recipients will receive the guide via US Mail within three weeks after a teen receives his/her permit. Safety Insurance has partnered with the Massachusetts Department of Transportation, the Registry of Motor Vehicles, the Safe Roads Alliance, Travelers Marketing and J. F. Griffin to sponsor the program at no cost to families or taxpayers.

The Department of Transitional Assistance opened an office at 1515 Hancock Street in Quincy on October 3rd. The office will allow Quincy residents more convenient access to services and will also be available to people from Dedham, Dorchester (zip codes 02122 & 02124), Milton, Norwood, Westwood, Braintree, Weymouth, Hingham, Hull, Cohasset, Norwell and Situate.

For the first time in Massachusetts early voting opportunities are

required in all cities and towns. Here in Quincy, you can go to the City Clerk's office at City Hall starting on October 24th (two weeks before election day) and up until November 4th (the Friday before the election) to cast your ballot according to this schedule: Monday and Wednesday 8:30AM-7PM; Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 8:30AM-5:00 PM. Additionally, on Saturday, October 29th from 8:30AM-5:00PM, voters can go to North Quincy High School to vote. The last day to register to vote is Wednesday, October 19th. Check online to make sure you're registered, how to register if you're not and where you vote: <http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elevotertools.htm>. Given the expectation of a very high voter turnout on November 8th, the hope is that voters who are committed to their candidates can get their votes in early and reduce the wait at the polls on election days.





## Manet Community Health Center

### Opioid Treatment Program

Manet Community Health Center has hired a new nurse case manager for the company's new office-based opioid treatment program, which is being piloted in Quincy.

Manet has hired Corinne Sieben, BSN, RN, who has more than 17 years of community health nursing, including 15 years working in the inpatient dual-diagnosis unit at McLean Hospital in Belmont. Dual-diagnosis is when someone has a psychiatric disorder and a substance abuse problem.

Manet's opioid treatment program, has been funded through the state's Department of Public Health. Boston Medical Center is providing technical assistance, presently the program will be administered at Snug Harbor and North Quincy locations.

The program enables Manet to offer both buprenorphine, sometimes known as Suboxone, and injectable naltrexone, sometimes known as Vivitrol, to opioid-dependent patients in the privacy of their doctor's offices.
