# SECRETS ARE REVEALED. SINS ARE CONFESSED. THE SOCIAL ORDER IS CHALLENGED. AN INSPECTOR CALLS OPENS MARCH 2.

The Barnstable Comedy Club is pleased to present a masterpiece of twentieth-century British drama: *An Inspector Calls* by J.B. Priestly. Structured as a classic thriller, the play focuses on an upper-class English family that is torn apart during the course of an inquest into a young working-class woman's descent into prostitution.

The play is directed by James F. Ring and features some of the finest actors currently working on Cape Cod, including Rob Minshall as Inspector Goole, Miranda Daniloff Mancusi as Sybil Birling, Kelly Kean as Sheila Birling, Larry Lickteig as Arthur Birling, John Hanright as Eric Birling, Dan Svirsky as Gerald Croft and Erika Slater and Cissy George who share the role of Edna. Mr. Ring directed the highly acclaimed *Pack Of Lies* last season.

The show opens on Thursday, March 2 at 7:30 PM and continues through March 19 with performances on Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:30 PM; Sunday matinees at 2:30 PM.
