It should remind us how blessed we are to be able to send over \$3,000 to MUST to help them resolve other internal needs, so that they can focus on God's plan to use them to spread the gospel! From David Lian: "I wanted to take a moment to thank you for your generous support of \$3,150 for Hnin and the relief efforts for MUST. I received your contribution today, and it means a lot to us. I will keep you updated on how your support is being utilized."

This is a brief biography of *Grace Siang Nawl Chin*. Grace was born to Mr. Chit Htun and Mrs. Moe Moe Shwe. At just two months old, in 2014, she was admitted to Grace House, a nurturing environment established to care for children in need. Hnin Sandar Aye played a pivotal role in bringing Grace to this safe haven. For many years, Grace was lovingly cared for by Dr. Nu Nu Way, the founder and owner of Grace House. Throughout her time at Grace House, Dr. Way developed a deep affection for Grace, treating her as if she were her own child. Tragically, Grace's life took a difficult turn when Dr. Way was diagnosed with stomach cancer. She passed away in 2023, leaving a profound void in the lives of those she cared for. Following Dr. Way's passing, Grace's sister, Aye Lee, stepped in to take care of her and the other children at Grace House. Aye Lee worked diligently to manage the responsibilities of the ministry, but she faced challenges due to her limited resources. She found it difficult to provide



the same level of care and support that Dr. Way had offered. In her efforts to ensure the well-being of the children, Aye Lee sought to reunite them with their relatives. However, Grace Chin, having no relatives to turn to, was placed in Agape House (at MUST) just yesterday. Grace had become accustomed to a certain level of comfort and often expresses her desire to return to her previous home. This transition may be challenging for her, and we are committed to showing her unconditional love and support during this time of adjustment. Our goal is to create a nurturing environment where Grace can thrive and feel secure, helping her to navigate the changes in her life with compassion and understanding.

*Meals 4 Children – We have now had 6 distribution (2 in February, March, and April) so far, and are now preparing weekend meals for 17 students (a couple at the High School have been added to the number from Stewart, Bon Air, and Huston). We will do 2 more distributions this month, and a "bonus" distribution the last week of the school year to help free up space in the church, etc. Both Redemption Church and Grace Community Presbyterian have been active in partnering with us to make this happen, along with PACS (Pittsburgh Area Community Schools – which provides 20% of the food). Since only 3 churches are currently committed, we hope to use the break during the summer to approach local businesses in lieu of other community churches. Also, your donations to this cause help greatly, and will make it possible to increase to 25-30 students in the 2025-2026 school year.

*Dementia Caregiver Presentation – We are working with Presbyterian Senior Care (Oakmont) to bring a professional to give a special presentation to help those caring for people with dementia/Alzhemer's. This one-hour presentation would be free to participants and hosted at Puckety Church. Do you have someone with a form of dementia in your family? Do you have a friend who could benefit from some education or resources in such care? We need your help to 1) narrow down ideal times for such a presentation (so a maximum of those interested can attend) and 2) help promoting and communicating the event. PLEASE contact the officer or Pastor Brian (724-678-6976) to sign up, ask questions, or volunteer to promote.

***Vitalant Blood Drive**

We need your HELP! Puckety has agreed to host a Blood Drive (using Faith Hall). Vitalant needs 20 people signed up before they will officially confirm the drive. Everyone's question will be: "When is it?" We want to have it at a time that maximizes the availability of the Hall and the schedules of donors. It will be a 5-hour event to allow flexibility. Right now, it will probably be a **Thursday (from 1:00 to 6:00 PM).** The three options we're exploring are: *July 10th, 17th and 24th*. To make it simple, if you can sign up for one *or more* of these days for any hour in that timeframe, please sign the sheet in the hallway or let the office know. Once we have 20, we can further promote in the community. Each donor helps 4 people in need. Please join us in this way to help save lives.



A DEVOTION FOR YOU - Read Hebrews 4:6-13

I washed the kitchen knife, put it down for a moment and then picked it up to dry it. As I did so, I felt what seemed like a slight tickle at the end of one finger. I looked down, and to my surprise and alarm saw blood spurting out of a neat, straight cut across the end. [For those of you who own Cutco cutlery, you probably have learned not to 'lose them' in soapy water – hint, hint – they are SHARP]. The sharper a blade is, I discovered, the less you feel when you cut yourself. It had gone straight through skin and into flesh with no trouble at all! That's the image Hebrews is using in verse 12 of ch. 4 to describe the effect of God's Word in someone's life. It's sharp enough to go straight in, almost without you realizing it. The difference is that the writer isn't talking about a carving knife, but a sword (double-edged), a weapon that would not just cut into a finger but could very easily go right through your body, into your heart. No escape. As one of Wiebke and my favorite hosts on the show, Forged in Fire, says as he slices into a body dummy: "It will CUT!" ... "Uh, ok" someone says, "what about some protection or body armor or something ... to stop the blade?" Nope. Nothing. Verse 13 is quite clear: when it comes to God and his Word, there is nowhere to hide. We shall all one day have to make an account of our lives, our inner lives and outer lives alike. Hebrews doesn't seem to be a very relaxing book, does it? I think the kids today would say, it has "no chill." Perhaps. But it's necessary for us today.

Many of you know we just started a sermon series on the Epistle of *Hebrews*. If you haven't yet, again I challenge you to read the whole letter (in one day if possible) before this coming Sunday, making a two-columned list, marking down "Major themes" on one side as you read, and jotting down "My Questions" on the other side. People think Hebrews is a "hard" letter. I hope you'll join me in seeing it is still powerfully relevant in helping us fix our eyes on Jesus – our "True North" (intentional reference to our summer VBS as the series is gearing up for it).

What our author does not want to see happen is for any of us to grow dull or be left to wander, so that by a steady erosion of belief, we result in unbelief, and finally fail to enter the "rest," the beautiful destination our Pioneer has blazed the trail to. If it's "relaxation" you want, don't expect too much of it in the present Christian life – God gives us the Sabbath each week so we don't burn out spiritually, but this life will still require a lot of cutting through the thorns and thistles. But remember that you are promised a REAL rest at the end. The road to that 'rest' is labelled "belief" ... "trust" ... "holding on" ... "firm grip on the confession of faith" ... and so on. God's Word (the 'double-edged sword' here) is the combination of the ancient, inspired Scriptures (one side) and the message about how they all have come true in Jesus (the other side, if you will) – do you see how we need both? One final thought – I see the sword of God's Word to be a lot like Jesus the evening of Easter day. Though the doors were locked – though the "believers" were afraid and wandering off the trail into unbelief – Jesus (the Word of God) penetrated right through the doors and then their fears. He came with the kind of grace only God can give - to rebuke their fear, but then to breathe peace upon them (two times by the way, as if to say his "Rest" is bigger, stronger, than their fear.) Like that, though Hebrews is a warning, it is also a great encouragement. If you have a choice between letting the doctor see you right away, and waiting until he can do a post-mortem on you ... it's wise to go for the first. If you open yourself, day by day, week by week, to the message of Scripture, its grand sweep and intimate details, and allow Jesus' faithful achievement to penetrate into your imagination and heart ... to know that gentle and powerful Touch ... a very sharp and fine blade ... but more like a scalpel, it's purpose is to heal - or to use Jesus' own image about his Father as a Gardener (John 15), the purpose of the pruning shears is to "cleanse" so that the branches will bear even more fruit.

Manse Sewer Line Repair

As you may remember in February of this year, the manse sewer line was blocked by roots that had grown through the terra cotta pipe that connects to the city mainline sewer. Of course, when such a block in the line occurs water, and related material backs up into the basement of the residence. This has happened several times before over the course of many years, but the frequency was becoming problematic, because it creates an immediate need for a thorough Herculean clean-up. Such an event can also have serious health implications.

The grinding out of the roots in the line is only a temporary solution, ultimately the right thing to do was replace the terra cotta sections of the pipe. Prior to this time, five bids were received and reviewed by Upkeep. With Upkeep's recommendation, the repair was approved by Session. The repair was done on April 17th and 18th by Arnold and Sons Plumbing of Natrona Heights for \$5000. Upkeep felt this was an extremely fair price. Arnold and Sons took into consideration that we were a church and this was an unbudgeted expense.

The roots should not be able to penetrate the sections of PVC piping and the new epoxy blown- in piping sections. The epoxy system is a relatively new process that needs only limited excavation.

We wish to thank Brian and Weibke for their hard work and patience while dealing with this matter.
