Pastor Brown and his wife Teresa are the Senior Pastors of Side-By-Side Church International located in Santa Ana, Calif.

They collaborate with grass root organizations throughout the world to transform injustice locally, nationally and internationally by training, equipping and providing support for those organizations to accomplish their mission.

Side-By-Side Church International was incorporated as an NGO within the Kurdistan Region of Iraq in August of 2016. Once the appropriate goals and objectives were put in place, the work with Khaleel and Ameena became a partnership.

The next goal was to establish a collaborative network of the various entities involved in the rescue of victims from ISIS. This included military, political and the Kurdistan Government's Office of Kidnapping Affairs.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Successful collaborative effort results in thirty-six men, women and children rescued from ISIS in one mission.

While all rescues are "SIGNIFICANT" for victims and victim's family members, I want to highlight the rescue that took place in March of 2017. I have selected this rescue as it demonstrates the high level of collaboration necessary to safely rescue victims while incorporating all entities of the collaborative group.

This mission involved the rescue of 36 men, women and children from ISIS. It required coordinating the transportation of this large group as well as ensuring the necessary provisions were in place during their transport. It also required coordination with the military as well as coalition forces. Once the victims were safely transported to Duhok, the Office of Kidnapping Affairs was involved.


This is an excellent example of how the various entities could work side by side to ensure the victims were safely rescued.









None of the monies involved in the rescues were given directly or indirectly to ISIS.




June - December 2016 Rescues and Expenditures
