1. **ne exeat:** a writ which is issued to restrain a person from leaving the jurisdiction of the court
2. **nisi:** unless; indicates that the adjudication spoken of is valid and operative unless the party affected by it appears and shows cause against it
3. **noblesse oblige:** nobility or rank imposes obligation
4. **nolle prosequi:** an ending of a criminal case (usually in federal court) because the prosecutor declares that he will proceed no further
5. **non obstante veredicto:** notwithstanding the verdict; reverses the determination of the jury
6. **non prosequitur:** he do not follow up or pursue; a defendant may get a judgment against a plaintiff who does not take the steps he ought to take in pursuing his action
7. **nota bene:** note well
8. **nudum pactum:** a nude contract; one made without any consideration
9. **nugatory:** invalid; ineffectual
10. **nunc pro tunc:** now and for then; with retroactive effect; applies to acts allowed to be done after they should have been done and which will have retroactive effect
