
Puzzle 33

Trace each shape with your finger and say its name.



### The Acmar Community Quilt

Young folks today probably think of shopping from home as a new thing, but here in Acmar, people were shopping from home over a century ago and in many different ways since. Long before the Home Shopping Network, internet, Amazon, and Wal-Mart, other options existed for shopping from home in Acmar.

Of course, many items could be purchased at the nearby company commissary during its time of operation, but many Acmar ladies sometimes found there were other things they would like that were not available locally. When Acmar was established in 1908, Sears & Roebuck was a well established retailer in Chicago. When the U.S. Postal Service began rural delivery of parcel post in 1913, it became possible for Sears to send its merchandise to many customers in rural or isolated areas. The Sears Catalog sold a wide range of merchandise at low prices so most homes in Acmar had one until it was discontinued in 1993.






The Jewel Tea Company sold household products through traveling salesmen from the 1930s to 1981. As the salesman visited door to door in Acmar, housewives could purchase coffee, tea, grocery items, cleaning supplies, linens, cookware, and china. They earned "premiums" for each purchase which could later be traded for items like the popular "Autumn Leaf" line of dishes which can still be found in some Acmar households today.



**S&H** Green Stamps was a line of "trading stamps" popular in the United States from the 1930s until the late 1980s. Customers received the green stamps as a reward for purchases at the checkout counters of retailers, mostly grocery stores. The stamps would be collected and attached to the pages of a small "saver book" supplied by the company. Sperry & Hutchinson Company (S&H) sent out a rewards catalog detailing merchandise which could be given by redeeming a certain number of stamps. During the 1960s through 1981, the Top Value Company promoted its yellow stamps very much like the Green Stamps. They also provided a catalog which customers used to earn premiums like toys, household merchandise, and many other items. These items could be selected at home from the catalogs and picked up at a "Redemption Center".



Of course, there was no two-day shipping or Prime membership deals, but the (mostly) ladies of Acmar were still able to shop from home and bring items into their households they could not get locally.
