JLNS is proud to support SCHTTF in its fight against human trafficking in Sonoma County. The District Attorney's Office chairs the task force, a group comprised

of 19 organizations throughout the county, which seeks to prevent trafficking and rehabilitate victims. It is the task force's collaborative efforts and the unique design that has helped so many women and children. Gioia Garner, past JLNS president, was appointed to the SCHTTF in February 2017 to represent JLNS and now Penny Herman, our incoming president, represents JLNS on the task force. JLNS also supported the task force's annual billboard campaign to raise awareness in our community.



The Living Room

JLNS is proud to support the Living Room, the only day center in Sonoma County that

State Public Affairs Committee

JLNS is active in legislative advocacy and continues in partnership with 16 other Leagues throughout California to draft and support legislation that

affect education, health, violence prevention, human trafficking, and family support across the state. Since 1971, the Junior Leagues of California State Public Affairs Committee (CalSPAC) has represented the interests of its member Leagues and their community projects to policymakers at the national, state, and local levels. Since 1992, CalSPAC has sponsored over half a dozen bills and co-sponsored three bills that are now California Law; sponsored two California Resolutions; and co-sponsored one Congressional Resolution. Our voice in Sacramento is powerful, and we are proud of our nonpartisan efforts.

Through our continued partnerships in Sonoma County, we were instrumental in the development of VOICES, a program to help youth aging out of the foster card system. The

combination of our grant money, countless volunteer hours, and projects has supported VOICES in helping hundreds of youth find their place in our community, and receive information and support with employment, housing, educational opportunities, medical and mental health services, and other valuable life skills. *voicesyouthcenter.org*



Redwood Empire Food Bank

More than ever, the Redwood Empire Food Bank supported our community through hardships (evacuations, wildfires, and the

pandemic.) We held a number of our Done-in-a-Day (DIAD) volunteering events at REFB, packing boxes or bags of food for families in need. Since 1987, the Redwood Empire Food Bank's service has expanded to focus on providing as much healthy food as possible and including nutrition education. REFB currently assists over 82,000 Sonoma County residents every month.

During weekly visits to the farm, lowincome at-risk youth learn the value of fresh fruits & vegetables by planting, cultivating, and harvesting produce themselves. They celebrate each

harvest through cooking lessons that incorporate the produce that they have raised. They send weekly boxes of produce to the children's foster and group homes. This year, League members volunteered at the farm and garden to help with planting and tending to the gardens and animals.


SPAC - Year in Review

It was another great year for the Junior Leagues of California State Public Affairs Committee (SPAC). SPAC is 17 California Leagues strong and represents over 10,000 League women who volunteer over 110,000 hours and spend over \$1.1 million to better their communities.

Your delegates Margaret Sluyk (outgoing Senior) and Katie Bivin (outgoing Junior / incoming Senior) worked hard to represent JLNS at the state level and to "bring SPAC home" to our JLNS membership. SPAC hosted a Bubbles & Ballots session where we learned what items were on our local ballot and how to understand all the facts to make an informed vote. In addition, there was an educational session, teaching members how to analyze a bill.

Although this year continued to be challenging with the pandemic, we continued with virtual conferences and presentations throughout the year. With three conferences and four presentations on each focus area, it was a busy year. We heard from several Assembly members from across California and learned from key organizations about what policies matter to the work they do and how advocacy can play a key role in their important work.

In preparation for her Senior SPAC year, Katie had training about the Bill Analysis Process & Presentations. Our delegates served on the Family Support and Human Trafficking.



Rising Star Award
