


## Substance use in the past 12 months: Chicago, IL Survey dates: March 24–26, 2023 N=363

Chicago

The Rapid Street Reporting (RSR) team visited Chicago, IL on March 24–26, 2023. Following alcohol and marijuana, the next most commonly reported substances were powder cocaine (8.8%), crack (7.4%), and psilocybin (7.4%). Additionally, the RSR team received one report of xylazine use and one report of phenibut use.

- ‡ Benzodiazepines include Xanax/alprazolam, Valium/diazepam, Klonopin/clonazopam, Rohypnol/roofies, Ativan/lorazepam, and Haldol.
- § Prescription opioids include Vicodin/other hydrocodone, OxyContin/other oxycodone such as Percocet or roxicodone, codeine with Tylenol, methadone, and morphine.
- \*\* Other opioids include heroin and U-47700/U4, pink, pinky.
- \* Prescription stimulants include nonmedical use of Adderall, Ritalin, or another drug for ADHD.
- ^ Other psychedelics include 1P-LSD, ALD-52/Orange Sunshine, AL-LAD, LSZ, DOB, and DOC.

- ¶ Euphoric stimulants include 4-FA, 5/6-APB/Benzofury, MDEA/Eve, and TMA.







## **Demographics of Chicago, IL Participants**
