#### First Lesson: Genesis 9:8-17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, <sup>9</sup> "As for Me, I am establishing My covenant with you and your descendants after you, <sup>10</sup> and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark (*Heb adds every animal out of the ark.*)<sup>11</sup> I establish My covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth."

<sup>12</sup> God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between Me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: <sup>13</sup> I have set <u>My bow</u> in the clouds, and it <u>shall be a sign of the covenant</u> between Me and the earth. <sup>14</sup> When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, <sup>15</sup> I will remember My covenant that is between Me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. <sup>16</sup> When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember **the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature** of all flesh that is on the earth."

<sup>17</sup> God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between Me and all flesh that is on the earth."

### Second Lesson: 1 Peter 3:18-22

For **Christ also suffered** (*Other ancient authorities translate 'died.'*) **for sins once, for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit,** <sup>19</sup> in which also He went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, (*as confessed in the Apostles Greed*)<sup>20</sup> who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. <sup>21</sup> And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal (*a pledge*) to God for <u>a good conscience</u>, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, <sup>22</sup> who has gone into heaven. and is at the right hand of God, <u>with angels</u>, authorities, and powers made subject to Him.

### Gospel: Matthew 25:34-46 NIV

"Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed by My Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave Me something to eat, I was thirsty, and you gave Me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited Me in, I needed clothes and you clothed Me, I was sick, and you looked after Me, I was in prison, and you came to visit Me.'

"Then the righteous will answer Him, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You something to drink? When did we see You a stranger and invite You in, or needing clothes and clothe You? When did we see You sick or in prison and go to visit You?'

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of Mine, you did for Me.'

"Then He will say to those on His left, 'Depart from Me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry, and you gave Me nothing to eat, I was thirsty, and you gave Me nothing to drink, I was a stranger, and you did not invite Me in; I needed clothes, and you did not clothe Me; I was sick and in prison and you did not look after Me.'

"They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help You?'

"He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for Me.' "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

Mark 1:14-15 The Beginning of the Galilean Ministry (after Jesus' baptism & forty days of testing in the wilderness)

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news (*the gospel*) of (*the kingdom*) of God, <sup>15</sup> and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; (*is at hand*) repent, and believe in the good news (*gospel.*)" **Footnotes:** <u>Mark 1:11</u> Or *my beloved Son*
