All Hands On Deck!



As stewards of the Straight Farmhouse, the Friends are continually repairing or maintaining some part of the circa 1866 Gothic farmhouse. In early October 2013, volunteers Marshall Hill and Bob Taylor replaced the weather-worn wood on the east porch deck of the farmhouse with new pressure-treated wood, handrails and stairs. Fortunately, the understructure was still solid, so the decision was made to save the structurally sound framing joists and purchase new deckboards, railings and steps. As you can see from the accompanying photo, the new porch deck complements the Straight Farmhouse and is now a safe exit from the sun porch/resale shop. Total cost of the lumber for this project was just under \$250. And we are very grateful for the hard work and donated labor of both Marshall Hill and Bob Taylor. Job well done!
