News from Fort Dauphin and the Friends of Toliara

160 years ago, the first Anglican missionaries arrived in Foulpointe Madagascar. Foulpointe is a town in the middle of the east coast of Madagascar. So it is north of Fort Dauphin.

The Episcopal Church of Madagascar held a competition for a locally created song to commemorate the celebration which was held on May 25 and 26 in Antananarivo. The winners of the

competition was the Herin'ny Finoana (Power of Faith) choir of St. Luke's in the Ankilifaly section of Toliara town. If you attended our book studies of Patsy McGregor's books about Madagascar, you might remember that "The Box" (Patsy's and Todd's apartment) was next door to St Luke's. A picture of "The Box" next door to St. Luke's is at the bottom of this article. Also at the bottom of the article is a picture of the choir. I believe this is the choir that is featured in the short video clip which was in the Parish News two weeks ago. They have produced an album of songs which they hope will be heard by people who are illiterate so they can hear of God's love for them. They are also hoping the songs will become part of the worship in the churches throughout the Diocese of Toliara (and maybe beyond).

According to the newest Friends of Toliara newsletter "Psalm 98 encourages us to "Sing a New Song to the Lord". That is certainly what the Diocese of Toliara is doing. For the last year or so, people in the Diocese have been writing hymns and songs in their own language to use alongside the western hymns they inherited from the missionaries who brought the Christian faith to the island."

Unfortunately Bishop Samy, Rev. Berthier, Venerable Noel and two evangelists were on their way to the opening celebration in Antananarivo when they were involved in an early morning accident. According to news reaching Rev. Victor (Rev. Nolavy's husband) everyone was unhurt except for Venerable Noel who was taken to the hospital. I have not heard anything more serious so everyone must be okay now.

A few short term mission trip teams from Florida, the UK and France will be visiting Toliara in June. A guy I work with a lot from the UK sent me his itinerary and it looks awesome. They do have 5 days scheduled to do a lot of animal reserve visiting in Kenya along with a couple days of meetings as well. Their whole trip will run from Tuesday, June 4 through Sunday, June 30. They will have many meetings in the Diocese of Toliara and my friend, John, will be installed as a canon to the Diocese on Sunday, June 16. It sounds like a very, very exciting trip.

Please pray for all the meetings and travel of these people.

We will, again, be raising money for the government primary school in Tsiharoa (pronounced See-Har-A) and the United Way "Stuff the Bus". I have picked up the posters and other information from the United Way and checked with Walmart on when they will be putting out their school supplies. It sounds like sometime in July. I will be putting out the Tsiharoa Government Primary school information in another week or two as well. Watch for all of it in the next few weeks. This is our opportunity to help children in huge need to be educated. Education is the best way to get out of poverty.
