I am happy to be able to report that as of last Friday the 24th, RI President Ravi Ravindran announced that Nigeria has gone one full year without a single case of Polio. Moving forward, if the stringent World Health Organization testing criteria are met, then Nigeria could be removed from the list of polio-endemic countries in September of this year. That would leave only the countries of Pakistan and Afghanistan. Let's work together to get this done!
