

Pastor's Study Desk Notes 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday Lent

Year C

Luke 9:28b-36

Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

"For nothing will be impossible for God" (Luke 1:37) The Angel Gabriel had announced this to Mary back in the beginning of Luke's gospel. A sign of great things to come for us! With today's gospel and the revelation of Jesus' divinity to Peter James and John on the mountain, the message is the same, about what God can make possible. I like to say that on the first Sunday of Lent, our church always has us focus on what we are up against (the Devil's temptations). But don't be discouraged, because on this second Sunday of Lent, the Church sets before us what is possible if we persevere with Christ! Transforming change -Transfiguration!

God can remake us in His Image, if we cooperate with Him. First, we need God to initiate this change of us, which Jesus has done already (the invitation of Lent itself!) And secondly, we need to persevere with Him in the work of our transformation. Luke 9:2, tells us that Jesus 'led' or 'took' Peter James and John up the mountain. Jesus starts us on the path of improvement. But of course, we have all walked uphill before and know that it takes our effort too! And, it is a hill! We must strive and work. But with Him, our change is possible. Jesus teaches this in John 15:5 "Apart from me you can do nothing, but remaining in Me, you will bear fruit." So, this Mountaintop Transfiguration scene moves us to step up and answer His call for us to grow more into His image. Our Lenten discipleship project of fasting, prayer and charitable work will transform us more into His People.

Something striking to me always about the Mountaintop Transfiguration is the presence of Moses, Elijah, Peter, James and John. It is a type of conference meeting (summit!) That teaches me that lasting transformation requires the accountability measure of involving other people in consultation and dialogue. We see on the mountain that Jesus first converses with Moses and Elijah (what did they speak about? Luke 9:31 says "his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem"). After this, Peter makes a false start of conversation (distracting idle chatter? Luke says Peter doesn't know what he is saying in 9:33) To this, God the Father resets the dialogue by announcing, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." Again, it takes God to initiate our change – we must begin by listening! In the Old Covenant, Moses alone goes up the mountain to converse with God (receive the ten commandments etc), yet in the New Covenant with Jesus, we see Moses, Elijah, Peter, James and John go up together. That says something about shared experience of God that we can learn from, living in Christ's company-the Church.

So, the first step forward in our own conversion after reading Jesus' Transfiguration event, can be our commitment to *'listen more' and speak less*. Peter, James and John begin their conversions to Christ afterward by going silent, as Luke tells us that "They fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen (*yet*)"(Lk 9:36) That is the needed posture to have God change us for the better- to start listening better! They are taking God's command to heart.

A good question for each of us to answer and act on is, "How can we 'listen more' to God"? What kind of listening exercise can we take up? I ran across a statistic recently that reported that on average, a person speaks over 16,000 words a day. 16,000 of anything is a lot! I am afraid to ask how many of those 16,000 words are necessary or wise (*afraid to ask, but also asking may add to my allotment of words, won't it?*) For transfiguration to occur, we need to listen first, and maybe keep on listening, instead of speaking up at all. Lent invites all of us to such a new 'listening' prayer, silent prayer-contemplative prayer with Christ. At higher elevations, on the mountain top, it is wise to save your breath. So, what will I do to foster more time of simply listening to God in Lent?

If I go back to the beginning of this column, I am reminded that Mary sets a great example for us of 'listening to God best' as she is the exemplary model of a disciple of Christ. Perhaps my Lent should be spent more in silent prayer like hers. She, "pondered, what was said, what sort of greeting this might be" after the angel Gabriel spoke to her (Luke 1:29). She also "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19) after the shepherds shared their angelic vision about Christ to her. And she "kept all these things in her heart" (Luke 2:51) after hearing Jesus' wisdom shared among the teachers when she found Him in the Temple. What an example of 'listening prayer' to follow!
