### How to Help Fr. Andrew Lee

- 1) Write two letters—They can be the exact same letter, just addressed to two different people. Print two copies of each letter.
  
- 2) You can either:
  - Mail the letters direct, one to DC and one to Nebraska, and bring the extra signed copies to the parish; OR
  - Bring all four letters to the parish. The parish will mail one to DC, one to Nebraska, and provide the lawyer with the two copies to submit with the legal arguments.

- 4) Under the address in each letter add: RE: Fr. Andrew Lee, LIN1990181231. This is critical. They must have a case reference number.
  
- 5) The lawyer suggests the letters:
  - talk about the impact on you, or your family, and the parish in general, if Fr. Andrew is forced to leave the country.
  - they should mention that it's through no fault of his own, and strictly because of technical reasons that Fr. Lee is in this position.
  - in your opinion, Fr. Lee didn't willfully violate the law. Immigration law is complicated. It's not his job to understand it.

If you wrote a letter on Fr. Lee's behalf for the package that was submitted in June, you can use that same letter as the basis for this letter. This letter is going to different people.

**Letters need to be mailed (if you are mailing direct) and turned into Holy Cross Parish by NOON MONDAY AUGUST 12th!**

## **Subject: Fr. Andrew's immigration situation**

Hello everyone,

I am sending you this email with an attachment because Fr. Andrew Lee is in need of assistance from people that know him. His official Korean name is **Sung Kyu Lee**

Due to an oversight regarding the immigration process for Fr. Andrew, his visa expired and after his appeal was denied, he has been told that he must leave the country. He has asked for his immigration case to be reopened, otherwise, he will have to leave the country by mid-August.

The attached is information and instruction on how you can assist with Fr. Andrew's case. Specifically writing a letter in support of his work and his impact that he has had on you and the benefit of him staying in the United States, working as a priest. Copies of your letter need to be sent to two officials (names listed on the attached information sheet) and then a third to Holy Cross Parish (2627 Lore Road, Anchorage, AK. 99517).

Please forward this information on to anyone who has known Fr. Andrew and who you think would be willing to write a letter on his behalf.
