<u>Advent Isaiah Trail</u> - We will offer a socially distant but meaningful way to prepare for the coming of our Lord on two Sunday evenings in Advent. You will start at the altar in the courtyard and use a flashlight to follow the signs to reflect, pray and complete activities. The experience will culminate with Holy Communion with Rev. Rhonda on the front porch of the church. *The trail will be open tonight, November 29 and next Sunday, December 6, 5-7 pm.*

<u>Family Nativity Activity Book</u> - At the conclusion of the Advent Trail, a family devotional kit for young families will be available. If you are unable to come to this event, you may arrange a pick-up at the church office.

<u>Night's Welcome</u> - Emmanuel has agreed that our day will be the second Tuesday of each month, so we will begin on the evening of *December 8 through breakfast on December 9*. They have asked us to restrict the number of volunteers actually coming to CUMC, so most of our meal preparations will be done offsite (either at church or at homes) and then brought to CUMC for distribution. We will be setting up an on-line sign-up sheet for those who can help and provide more details about the dining situation once we know.

<u>Stations of the Nativity</u> - On *December 13*, we will present an online Stations of the Nativity service as a companion to our contemplative Stations of the Cross service that was offered during Lent. A tableaux of nativity silhouettes and candles will connect readings, reflections and prayer.
