June Pacific Dawn Ron Coleman

The usual cast of characters drove up to Ventura through a light drizzle wondering what the next day would bring. After getting on the boat and getting equipment ready and finding a place for dinner, everyone was on the boat and ready to go. Pat called us in to the galley for the obligatory safety talk and the discussion about tomorrow's game plan. Pat had some hot information about a few white sea bass that were caught at Beachers (Santa Rosa Island). He then said that he thought that this group had caught enough rock cod and he would like to give the sea bass a good try in the morning, then maybe a few drifts for halibut. Then if we had to, we would move and do the rock cod thing. He also said that all of this depends on us getting squid tonight.

Almost everyone headed to bed to get some sleep so they would be ready for the early gray bite on the white sea bass, and maybe even have a good dream about WSB. I stayed up talking with the crew for a few minutes. Then we heard Pat over the PA tell us to get the squid nets ready *now*. There was a light boat 2 miles in front of us with a full float going on. I started helping with the nets when the relief deck hand said, "Sir, the crew does the work." I answered "OK." The anchor went down, the squid lights went on, and here came the squid. Pat was now down on the deck and looked at me standing out of the way and having a cigar and said, "What the hell are you doing, Ron? Put that thing out and get to work. Help us with the crowder." The poor relief deck hand just looked at Pat, then me, and shook his head. After filling 2 tanks and 8 gunny sacks with squid I told the poor guy that I have worked on boats and helped Pat before. I also said that he was correct in what he told me earlier. When Pat is in the wheel house you are in charge of the deck. The crew stayed up washing and putting 8 gunny sacks of squid into Zip-lock bags and I went to bed; it was now midnight.

At 5 a.m. the motors slowed and my fishing alarm clock went off. It's amazing to me that I need a loud alarm clock at home but on the ocean just slow down the motors and I'm up. Go fishing.

From 5 a.m. till about 8:30 we gave the Beachers area a very good try for the WSB with the usual results: ZIP, ZERO, NOTHING. I hate white sea bass!

Then it was off to try a few drifts for halibut. The tremendous amount of skill required to catch one of these elusive fish can be mind-boggling. Have 19 fisherman drag a weight with a hooked bait 3 feet behind it. The art is having your weight drag across the back of the halibut, wake it up, then hopefully it eats *your* bait and not the bait of the guy standing 3 feet from you.

Anyway, I was the lucky one on this trip who caught the only halibut.

After 4 or 5 more drifts and no more halibut it was off to the rock cod area--again. Then we started putting some fish in the sacks.

Lake Pacific was very nice to us at the cod grounds. No wind, and little current, allowing us to use light tackle and have some fun. The best example of going light was when



Joel caught a huge red on a little 3-oz. jig. Everyone was getting fish but because we spent so much time looking for WSB, we were not able to travel as far as we usually do to the place where we normally catch larger rock fish. Chuck Auer (pronounced "hour") was putting the hurt on his cousins, the chuckleheads. Mike Maurizio was also doing very well with his soon-to-be-ready-for-mass-production mouse jig.

Having my luck stay with me I hit a nice ling cod on the head with my jig and made it mad enough that it ate it. Pat was standing next to me and gaffed the fish, then said that if I had as much skill as I had luck, someday I could be a real fisherman! The ling was the unofficial 2nd-place fish.



Mike Maurizio and I had a contest to see who could catch the next fish on a jig. Mike said it was the best beer that he has had in a long time... Paul Yazaki was finally able to join us on a trip, and as usual, caught a lot of fish. It was great to visit and fish with Paul again.

Now for the most painful part of the trip. Mickie (mad dog) somehow ended up with a 5/0 circle hook buried in his finger. Because it was a circle hook and a 5/0 they did not want to pull it out until they could get the xylocain into his finger. I talked with Pat a couple of days later and Mike was fine and went out fishing that night.
