

Red Ribbon Week: SRM will celebrate Oct. 24 - 28, 2022 Red Ribbon Week is the oldest and largest drug prevention campaign in the country. The National Family Partnership organized the first nationwide Red Ribbon Campaign in 1988. Since that time, the campaign has reached millions of U.S. children. Red Ribbon Week is an alcohol, tobacco and other drug and violence prevention awareness campaign observed annually in October in the United States.

## Poster Contest Rules:

-Contest open to all students

-Poster is to be presented on construction paper (12 X 18)

- Poster should include a message that promotes a drug-free lifestyle.

- Free-hand, computer generated/assisted designs, markers, and crayons may be used in the design of the poster.

- Posters are judged on artistic presentation and strength of message.

- Student's first and last name and grade MUST be on the back of the poster.

- All posters must be completed by Thursday, October 27<sup>th</sup>.

- Poster Parade (students may view the posters during recesses) on Friday. Judges will make their selection on Friday by 12:00 p.m.

- The winner will be announced on Friday afternoon at 2:45 p.m.!

Judging: Judging will be done by a group of impartial individuals who will evaluate each poster on originality, creativity, artistic design, and visual appeal.

There will be ONE GRAND PRIZE winner in each grade level who will

receive a Wendy's Gift Card.
