

Good morning!

In your pregame conference, do you mention 'Twos to threes and threes to twos?' take a look at one of these in a game [here](#).

On this 3-point shot, it is at the top of the key so it is T's responsibility in a 3-person game. The T did not have a 3-point preliminary and when the shot went in, the C signaled a made 3-point shot. The T actually gave a '2-point- signal to the table. This is not an approved mechanic but clarifies when close for the table. When the T sees the made 3-point mechanic from the C, he blows the whistle and they discuss it. Since it is T's primary, T signals to the table that it was a good 3-point goal.

We do not want 2 sets of eyes on this play as it is in T's primary. In this play, the rebound from the free throw went to the strong side (L and T side) near the corner. There are only a couple players in white on C's side so taking a peek at the three-point goal is acceptable. They ended up getting the play right and talking immediately was the right thing to do. When a situation like this happens, get it right immediately if possible. Communication is what we are all about and communicating with partners is a must!

Thursday extra: The table is part of our crew. We need to make sure they are on the same page as we are...horns for us on ALL subs, scorekeepers LOOKING AT US when we report a foul, timers not letting the foul total go over 5, scorekeepers communicating with each other at the end of quarters to make sure they agree scorekeepers sitting beside each other if possible...remind the table crew of these things we may take for granted!
