

were mailed to Arizona's public colleges and universities the first week of March announcing the annual funding of **THE LAURA BUSH SCHOLAR-SHIP** for the 2014-2015 academic years. We have received several confirmations of academic postings from colleges and universities which can usually be found at each institution's Outside Scholarships listings. The Committee voted in 2011 to open the Laura Bush Scholarship to 18 year old graduating seniors, using new guidelines written for that class of applicants, which are also posted on the 2014 AzFRW website.

On April 5th, AzFRW Scholarship Chair, Pat

Lutes, presented the 2014 **Dodie Londen TARS Memorial Scholarship,** as recommended by the AZ State TARS Advisor, Lois Fitch, to **Mackenzie Shane** a junior and member of Saguaro High TARS, at the TARS State Convention at Scottsdale Plaza Resort . Mackenzie's name is engraved on AzFRW's memorial plaque which hangs permanently at AzGOP State Headquarters.

To advertise our Committee's mission we created a perpetual graphic recording progress of member contributions, and a "story board" displayed at all AzFRW Convention and Quarterly meetings, illustrating the past year's winners. Four AZ achievement points are given for clubs

who donate to the AzFRW Laura Bush Scholarship.

Several years ago we encouraged our clubs to make a donation in memory of a deceased member. Many clubs made donations to AzFRW Scholarship in this manner, suggesting that the minimum donation should be \$25. We are reinstating this idea to include donations made in the name of family member also, and memorializing them on the Laura Bush Scholarship Certificate of Scholarship for that year.

It appeals to many as a good alternative to sending flowers to the deceased member's funeral. Donations can be transmitted on the new <u>AzFRW Scholarship</u> Donations form, to be

#### **Americanism Committee Report: Billie Orr**

On the weekend of May 26th, flags wave in the breeze; red, white and blue bunting graces banisters; and parades fill the main streets of America to the graves of 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there. It wasn't until after World War I that Decoration Day was expanded to honor those who sacrificed their lives in all American wars.

to

In 1971, Congress passed the National Holiday Act, which moved Memorial Day

to the last Monday in May. In 2000, Congress passed the National Moment of Remembrance Resolution. At three o'clock in the afternoon, local time, Americans are asked "to

voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a moment of remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to Taps."

How Memorial Day initially began is not known for certain, but Charleston, South Carolina, is often credited as being the original location when thousands of freed slaves and Union soldiers gathered at a racetrack to celebrate the Civil War victory in 1865. Such celebrations began to spring up throughout the country.

Three years after the Civil War, on May 5, 1868, an organization of Union veterans called the Grand Army of the Republic created Decoration Day. It was to be a day of remembrance and reflection for the many lives sacrificed during the Civil War. It is believed that the date of May 30 was chosen because flowers would be in bloom across the nation. On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated


During the first quarter, Dr. Maureen Hannley educated us on Agenda 21, a surreptitious takeover of private property by the federal government implemented by counties and cities.
