- Being overprotective of the family
- Sleeping more especially to withdraw from others
- Talking about how honorable it is to be a soldier

#### CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

#### **SEPTEMBER 2021**

#### THE IMPORTANCE OF REVIEWING YOUR GOVERNING DOCUMENTS

Remember The American Legion's mandated eligibility changes that occurred at the 2019 National Convention (1: "wives' to "spouses" and 2: Legion eligibility for veterans extended to all service since World War II) unless you have a provision in your bylaws that automatically amends them to be consistent with the national bylaws, your unit or department has to vote the changes into your governing documents.

# LET'S LOOK AT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE LEVELS OF THE ORGANIZATION

Units should have their own governing documents, elect their own officers, and make their decisions independently. Does that mean a unit can do whatever it wants? Well not exactly, the support of veterans and their families is the purpose of the American Legion Auxiliary. So, any change to the purpose in a unit's governing documents would be null and void.

A department cannot dictate to the unit that all units will have Taco Tuesdays. Or meet on Thursdays. Or wear only purple shirts. Units are independent affiliates, and their members vote to make those decisions themselves.

The national organization is not the grandparent, the department is not the parent, and the unit is not the child. Think of our relationships in the ALA as what we all are – friends with a common mission – to help our nation's heroes: its veterans and their families.

**District Presidents** – Please get with the Vice President for them to reach out to the Units in the Districts to see how they can help the Units with retention of members.



- Get involved in the Citizen Corps Council (www.ready.gov) to ensure citizens are prepared to respond to natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, blizzards and manmade disasters and emergencies. o Junior members can get involved in and/or start a Youth Preparedness Program in their community.
- Collect supplies for emergency preparedness kits and distribute them in your community.
  - Remember: new military families in your community may not be familiar with the types of emergencies that affect your area. As needed, help them update their emergency preparedness kit and plan.
- Encourage members to complete Community Emergency Response Training (CERT). Refer to *How to Train for FEMA's Community Emergency Response Teams* for information and specific steps.
- Have a training exercise in your post home to give training in first aid, CPR, or other types of emergency skills.
- Join with your Legion post to host a POW/MIA ceremony on National POW/MIA Recognition Day, commemorated annually on the third Friday of September. This year it will be celebrated 09/17/2021
- Follow the Legion's POW/MIA Empty Chair Resolution 288 for designating a POW/MIA Empty Chair at all official meetings.
- Host a remembrance event for any MIA servicemembers who have been identified from your area.
- Work with Legion posts to honor ROTC and JROTC cadets by having dinners and recognizing their accomplishments.

#### HOW TO BE A UNIT MENTOR

#### **PRESIDENTS CORNER**



"Making a Brighter World for Our Veterans"

I would like to discuss the basic fundamentals of everyday public relations that we use as an Auxiliary member.

- 1. The primary goal of any ALA public relations is to create positive publicity for Events, and Programs, of our stated Mission.
- 2. When producing a fund-raising event, it is especially important to let the Public know where all the money donated will go.
- 3. Let your potential donor know that we are a non-profit organization and if requested by the donor provide them with appropriate tax receipts.
- 4. Be sure to have all available membership and organizational information available to the public.
- 5. Be aware of where you are taking your pictures. You do not want to post pictures with beer bottles, alcohol, and beer signs. We do not want to leave the Community with a bad impression of what we represent, and we would be giving the liquor companies free advertising that they would normally pay thousands of dollars for in promoting their product. There is an easy solution for this, do not take any pictures in the bar area that you are planning to post. You can save those kinds of pictures on your private web site. Keep in mind that anything you post on an authorized American Legion Auxiliary site will reflect directly on our membership and the reputation of our organization.

6. To make this easier, try to ask people before you take a picture. Then you can move them to an acceptable background.

Please remember that posting on our website Ring your Bell is not your personnel website. Make sure that your pictures are respectable and tell the story that you want to express.

We are a proud organization. Let us represent our Auxiliary with dignity and convey our message, SERVICE NOT SELF.

#### VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 7-31-21

All events are suspended until further notice. There is communication that some volunteer activities will be restarting. No specifics as of this date. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Moderna vaccine has arrived and all staff who desired vaccination have been vaccinated. All Veterans and caregivers have been offered the two dose vaccine. Current numbers are encouraging according to Director.

Southwest Blind Rehabilitation Center is now opening back up. There is limited visitation at SAVAHCS. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time.

There is a new program in start-up process to assist Veterans patients with food insecurities. Once implemented, a separate food pantry will fill this need.

There are not yet any monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2021 to July 31, 2021.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2021 to July 31, 2021 is \$1,692.00. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 24, Unit 66, Unit 109, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Four registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2021 to July 31, 2021 is 551. **S AVAHCS is in the process of bringing back volunteers. Volunteers will be phased in as needed and the process will be closely monitored by the Director. Volunteers will be contacted by the Voluntary Service office as their services are needed. One more Auxiliary volunteer has been called back.**
