


Once again I want to congratulate Paul and Alex for winning a Gold award this year. We have a great newsletter. Thanks guys.

# Adventure to Albuquerque

We (Walter, Marianne, Bill and I) met up on Rte 78 at the Clinton Diner. The auspices were not good as the 56 developed an exhaust leak before meeting. Our Rte included the PA Turnpike and it was fun driving through the tunnels. Sights along the way included lots of corn, barns and wind turbines.

Our first stop was at Zainesville, OH where we had a great dinner at the Muddy Miser tavern and we found a great ice cream spot (Tom's Ice Cream Bowl). The next day we met John Duncan's son Steven at a rest area. Steven worked with Amos Minter (small world).

The next day we stopped at Carlinville, IL. Then we continued on, hitting rain through St. Louis and then a downpour about 78 miles outside of Springfield, MO. The trick from the Early Bird with the plastic bags worked great for catching the rain. We stopped at a town called Miami on Rte 66 where we happened upon a cruise night where the locals really made us feel welcome. We continued on to Tulsa, OK where we stopped (it was 9:30 PM long day).

The next day (Sunday the 23rd) we got up early as Walter and Bill were planning to work on the exhaust (we bought gaskets earlier in the trip) but it was thundering with pouring rain. I did laundry instead and we left around 10:30. We stopped in Clinton, OK to see the Rte 66 Museum (GREAT) which shows the history of Rte 66 through each decade up to the 80's when the Rte was decommissioned. We made a stop in Elk City, OK where they moved buildings to create an Old Towne with authentic items showing life in western OK. We continued on to the Cactus Inn in McLean, TX (FYI- do not plan to eat in this part of Texas on a Sunday as nothing is open). We had dinner in a gas station (surprisingly not bad) and had breakfast there the next day.

Monday was warm with blue skies and started the repair but the problem wasn't as we thought. We did a photo shoot with the cars at the first Phillips station in Texas where we met a man whose wife's grandfather ran the station in the 40's. On to Amarillo where we found the Old Santa Fe Railroad station and saw the Old Towne and shops . We also saw the Cadillac ranch. We refueled at Russell's Travel center where there was an incredible car and collectible museum. We stayed at the Blue Swallow Inn in Tucumcari which is a period motel - definitely worth the stop.

The next day Walter & Marianne stayed in Tucumcari while we continued on to Albuquerque.

We stopped in Santa Rosa and saw some more old gas stations. Continuing on, we drove about 20 miles of old Rte 66 toward Albuquerque. We met a bunch of travelers along the way exploring Rte 66 - definitely a wonderful experience.


