

Commander Joseph G. in his message in the March issue of K-G News covered the February 24th dance held by the post The only thing I can add is my thanks to the Committee and to those who sent in their donations knowing they could not be in attendance.

Commander Joe also mentioned about our sponsored Explorer Troop No. 87, but I would like to emplify on this activity. Committeemen have been chosen; officers for the troop have been elected; the troop will meet on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday evening of each month.

What we need now is teamwork by our Post members in getting new members for the troop. All boys between the ages of 14 and 17 are eligible. Your Service Officer Speaks!

EDUCATION: The U. S. Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee has reported S. 349, a cold-war GI Bill to the full Senate for consideration. The House of Representatives Committee on Veterans' Affairs is also expected to consider readjustment benefits for veterans with service in the Armed Forces since the end of the Korean conflict.

EDUCATION: The number of dependents does not effect the Korean GI Bill training allowance of a veteran enrolled less than one-half time in college. The training allowance paid rate for less than halftime training is either equal to the tuition and fees paid by non-veterans for a course or a proportionate amount based on \$110, a month for a full-time course which is considered to be at least 14 credit hours whichever is the lesser. A veteran, for example, taking six undergraduate college credit hours at \$40. a credit hour, would receive either an amount equivalent to the tuition and fees or 6/14ths of \$110. whichever is the lesser. Tuition would be \$240, whereas 6/14th of \$110 would amount to \$47.14 per month for the semester. The veteran in this example would receive the \$47.14 monthly rate, as it would be less than the tuition.

GI LOANS: Widows of WW II and Korean veterans who died in service or as the result of serviceconnected causes are eligible for GI Home Loans. Widows qualify for this benefit even though the deceased veteran may have obtained a GI loan prior to his death. A widow who is a veteran herself, however, does not qualify for a 2nd or 3rd GI Loan because of her husband's death.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Section 1, Article VI of the Post By-Laws states:

"There shall be a Post Nominating Committee which shall consist of five members. Such Committee shall be chosen at the first meeting in April of each year and shall serve until the annual election of officers in

June of each year."

Section 2, states: "Such Committee shall be elected pursuant to the following procedure: (1) Nominating shall be from the floor of ten members in good standing in the Post. The medal is a bronze octagon on which is displayed an eagle standing on fasces between two groups of stars and a spray of leaves.

The ribbon has two outside stripes of blue; between them, 13 red and white stripes.




