#### Let Us Set Down and Reason By Rodger Whisman

I was in study when I ran into an inspiration on 'markers'. As the children of Israel moved about and around they always left 'markers' of what transpired and where they had been.

As I too began a lifetime of 'markers' in my log I'd considered how many times and ways that God met me according to my needs, showing me a better path and had reasoned life with me. I had an outline I had started several different times. Within these logs I wanted to share a portion that always melted a growth in my heart and spirit, with all of you.

Know this, I'm one person that needs a lot of attention and time with God to just make life work out for me. And every time I had put any distance in that personal need for a close relationship, I had slipped away and into error. So let's get started and move into the article ...

It remains a great desire that in prayer these letters offer fresh inspiration. Therefore, without the divine guidance of the Holy Spirit all of these words are no more than good words. Only the Holy Spirit knows exactly where God is at work in our personal lives and needs. God uses diverse ways to reach out to us through church, others in Christ and by the Holy Scriptures. May God be praised and glorified in all we say and do. Let's look at 2 *Timothy 3:16* (KJV), "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness ..." Now look at how the NLT Version translates this same verse, "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right." The English Standard Version says, "All Scripture is God breathed ...." And now let's include 2 *Timothy 3:17* to get the full understanding of the previous verse, "God uses it to prepare and equip His people to do every good work."

Coming to the Lord, just as we are, in our current condition is simply the way to start. Yes we ARE accepted by Christ that simply. Listen here to Jesus, in *Matthew 11:28-30*, as He says, "Gourse to Ma, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you reat. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find reat for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."

For those of us that are within our calling and or election, we enter His gates with thanksgiving and praise. Before prayer, prior to the group share and or prior to worship we see, in *Psalm 100:4*, "*Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him, and bless His name.*" Now let's add *Verses' 3 and 5* to this, reading it in its full context. "Know ye that the LORD He is God: it is He that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture. Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him, and bless His name. For the LORD is good; His mercy is everlasting; and His truth endureth to all generations."

The Lord asks of us to be consistent and stable in our personal relationship with Him. These requests are not just to learn patience but as well to prepare us to work 'with' God in reaching others as the Holy Spirit works through us. We see, in **2** *Timothy* **2**:19-25, "Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness." In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for special purposes and some for common use. Those who cleanse themselves from the latter will be instruments for special purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work. Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth."

So, 'Let us set down and reason' with one another in Christ as it reads in *Isaiah 1:18-19*, "Come now, and let us reason together, saith the LORD: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool. If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land ... "We can reason on stability in Christ which is also a reasonable request, and more so as we minister to others in deed and word. Listen as Paul encourages us, in Romans 12:2, "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." Let me encourage you all to also read Romans 12:1 and Romans 12:8-11.

There will be times that we may even ask ourselves, "Who is this talking to me?" At that point are we in self made goals or have we entered into God's goals which also includes us; and that on the behalf of others? We find Paul saying this in **1** Corinthians 2:4, "And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demon

stration of the Spirit and of power ..." We will always have before us the ability to communicate with God, through Christ Jesus. Communication only deepens any relationship. We should consider communicating more often, knowing we can petition the Lord at any time for our needs of growth in ministry such as compassion and understanding to enter further in to the Lord's work, or His plans.

Entering into God's plans has always offered a goal for me larger than I was at that time. God always brings forth KING sized plans and goals. Yes, we can bring about a harvest in deed in good goals and plans. But if we begin to see God's plans and goals and we enter in to that, our harvest increases greatly and beyond our greatest expectations. Now, have we reasoned on these; Salvation, inspiration, consistency, communication by petition, stability and the greatness of God's goals?

So what was written? To reason is to share. To reason is not one sided. To reason is to better understand, to clarify. To reason opens avenues to reveal something or offer a new perspective. To reason with God is a divine right as a child of God's. A chance to not only be heard by Him, but an opportunity for Him to speak directly to us, by the Holy Spirit. It's like prayer. Prayer is not just what you do, it defines who we are in Christ. The ability to reason, to communicate both ways, begins to define more of who we are and will become in Christ, in our election and in our ministry. So let's be reasonable, allow the Lord the time to speak to us in whatever diverse manner the Holy Spirit reaches out to us.

I will share this and then close. I feel a new anointing has begun to flow on and around the children of the Kingdom of God. Through time God has anointed many great men and women of God. This time I feel God's glory will be revealed and fall upon ALL of us in a new way, the anointing of God's presence on His children as NEVER before.

May God bless you all. May He enlighten you. And if you are within a ministry, may He expand your boarders.

Dealing with Daily Troubles By G.B.B.

I pray that this message reach all of the South family, inside and out, living in the best of health and in all of God's promised blessings through our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus.

I would like to talk to everyone about how we deal with our daily troubles. The Bible tells us that we are to bring all of them to God first. I will be the first to admit that I struggle at times with obeying the Scriptures in this matter. I tend to want to fix my problems on my own. Let's see what the Bible has to say on this matter.

The very first passage that comes to mind here is *Proverbs 3:5-6* which tells us, "*Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths.*" The very first words we are encouraged to do here are very important. We are told to "*Trust in the Lord ...*" in our walk with Jesus. Again it is very important that we learn to trust Him first and foremost in ALL matters. We err greatly when we attempt to seek answers through the means of the world. All of our thoughts should go to God even before we act or react. If we feel depressed, sick, or worried we should go to God with it before we go to the doctor. Prayer should always come before pills to cure our ailments. This is not to say that God won't send us to a doctor but we need to learn to give God the opportunity to heal us BEFORE we let man get his hands on us. We are told, in *Psalm 37:5*, "*Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass.*" When what we want in life is in accordance with God's will He will bring it to pass. This is our lives.

We read, in *Psalm 37:23-24, "The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way. Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the LORD upholdeth him with his hand."* Jesus is the only one who never fell into sin during His earthly journey. All of the rest of us have fallen and will continue to fall numerous times before we get to be with our Heavenly Father. We are held by the hand of God and when we fall we fall into His palm. When we cry out and reach up for Him He picks us up. When Peter stepped out of the boat and began to walk ON the water he did so UNTIL he took his eyes off of Jesus and looked at the storm. At the moment that he looked away he started to sink 'into' the water. As soon as Peter cried out *"Lord save me"* Jesus immediately stretched forth His hands and caught him. Remember, God is no respecter of men so what He did for Peter He will do for any one of us when we cry out for His help.

Most of our problems come when we take our focus off of God and instead focus on the problems of this world we live in. In Colossians 3:2, Paul warns us against doing this when he said, "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth." We err greatly when we lose focus on what is really important. I know firsthand how easy it is sometimes to lose focus with all of the worldly enticements the devil throws at us every day. That's why Jesus, in Matthew 6:33 tells us to, "Ent seek thist his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." As children of God it isn't wise for us to be continuing to seek after the things of the world. When we keep our focus on Jesus and seek to do His will He will always be there in every aspect of our lives. God has already given us above and beyond our greatest need when He gave His Son Jesus. Our biggest problem is that we don't reach out and receive what has already been given to us.

Paul tells us, in Romans 8:5, "Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires." Quite simply Paul is saying that the best way we can receive all that God has for us is to walk in and live after the Spirit. Walking in the Spirit is not easy at first. Like everything else it takes a lot of daily practice. And I'll admit that sometimes it's really hard but God assures us that if we are obedient that He will direct our paths. We are told, in 1 Peter 5:7 to, "Casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you." The Word clearly does NOT say to cast 'some' of our cares or just the ones we cannot handle. The Word of God commands us to cast ALL of our cares upon Him. Our lives will be much more peaceful and fulfilling when we learn to do this.

My closing prayer is for us to ask God to search our lives and point out to us any areas where we are NOT depending on Him. I pray that we never forget what the Apostle Paul said in 2 Timothy 2:3-4, "Join with me in suffering, like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his

### Foot's Bible Study Rotes

#### Nehemiah 11:1-12:26

All these Scripture give lists of people and priests and Levites who were chosen by lots to who returned to Jerusalem, which some may have not wanted to do because living in Jerusalem required stricter obedience to God's Word because of greater social pressure and proximity to the temple. (11:1)

#### Job 12:1-15:35

When we look for guidance for our decisions, we must recognize that God's wisdom is superior to any the world has to offer. Don't let earthly advisors dampen your desire to know God better. (12:24-25)

God's solution to believers who live in an unfair world is to guarantee life with Him forever. No matter how unfair your present world seems, God offers the hope of being in His presence eternally. (14:1)

#### 1 Corinthians 10:14-15:58

As followers of Christ, we must give Him our total allegiance. We cannot, as Paul explains, have part in "The cup of the Lord ... and the cup of demons." Eating at the Lord's table means communing with Christ and identifying with His death. Drinking from the cup of demons means identifying with satan by worshipping or promoting pagan (or evil) activities. Are you leading two lives, trying to follow both Christ and the crowd? The Bible tells us you can't do both at the same time.

If death ended it all, enjoying the moment would be all that mattered. But Christians know that there is life beyond the grave and that our life on earth is only a preparation for our life that will never end. What you do today matters for eternity. In light of eternity, sin is a foolish gamble. (15:30-34)

#### Psalm 39:1-13

We all have complaints about our job, money or situation, but complaining to others may make them think that God cannot take care of us. It may also look as if we blame God for our troubles. Instead, like David, we should take our complaints directly to God. (39:1-3)

#### Proverbs 21:30-31

All our preparation for any task is useless without God. But even with God's help, we still must do our part and prepare. His control of the outcome does not negate our responsibilities. (21:31)

To the family in Christ, Overconces for Christ, I wanted to send you this short letter. I appreciate being on your mailing list and receiving that monthly newsletter. God has put it on my heart to share my testimony and I wanted to send it to ministries I hear from. If you choose to publish it in a future newsletter, I don't mind. I wanted to share with people what God has done in my life so far. As the Word tells us to go out to the nations and share His Word. I look forward to my next mailing that I receive from you. May God bless you all and everything you do.

I was born in a small town of eastern Pennsylvania in June 1974. I don't remember much of that time because my family moved out west to Phoenix, Arizona when I was 4 years old. Growing up, my parents said they raised both me and my sister the best they could, but I will discuss about that experience a little later. I was told I was loved, and even questioned that at times.

At around the age of 8 I started to act out. See, the love my family showed me was violence. My father had a terrible problem with anger. I remember times when he would have a bad day at work and would come home and take it out on my sister, mother and me. As I got older, I would purposely do things so he would take out his anger on me and leave my mother and sister alone.

I had gotten to the point of getting so tired of the abuse that I would fight kids at the school bus stop, smoke cigarettes, drink alcohol and even started finding drugs for an escape and pain. My drug and alcohol use expanded into me getting in trouble for stealing. I was out of control by the age of 12.

I used the juvenile system as a way to be free from my troubles at home. I started believing what I was being told, "You are a waste of life, and good for nothing." That stuck with me for a long time, even into my adulthood. I blamed everyone for everything that happened to me; never considering that, maybe I should blame myself.

In June of 2012, my life began to change. I was in prison at that time, as I am currently now. I got into trouble for having a cell phone. While I was in the lockdown unit, I used to pick on my cellmate, he was a Christian. At that time, I was following a pagan faith. The chaplain would come by my cell to check on us, but mainly to talk to my cellie. I thought they were weird! From hearing their conversations, I eventually started to ask questions. Keep in mind, I never have read the Bible yet. One day I asked the chaplain, "if your God is so good then why does He put us through situations like this?" He told me that "Some of us need to find our breaking point to then surrender our lives to Him." I thought about that statement and could see his point.

I then asked for a Bible and began to read it. I remember I read a story about Jesus giving a sermon, when He was done He was tired, so He told His disciples to get into the boats and go ahead, He would join up with them later, so they left. As they were on the water it was dark and a storm came their way. They got scared, looked out in the distance, and saw someone walking to them. At that time, the waters got calm and Peter asked, "Lord, is that You?" Jesus replied, "Yes," But they were in disbelief. Jesus told Peter to "Step outside the boat and come to Him," and so he did. Then something interesting happened, he took his eyes off Jesus and began to sink. Jesus then reached out to him and brought him to safety, and they got into the boat.

That passage meant the world to me, Jesus was talking to me I felt. It was like Jesus was telling me to "Come to Him." The next time I saw the chaplain I gave my life to Jesus and said the sinner's prayer, renouncing all the pagan gods out of my life and to follow Jesus. I continue to struggle with certain hang-ups at times, but I am sure most of us do daily. The most important thing is, I admit where I am wrong now, and ask for His forgiveness.

I got out of prison in 2013 and thought I was good. I was wrong. I took my eyes off Jesus and fell into addiction again. I went to court and was given a 10-year sentence for being a drug addict. Although my sentence might have been a little harsh, I accept it. Nobody made me use drugs again, I chose to! Jesus never wants us to do bad, but we are forgiven by the blood He shed for us at Golgotha. *Jeremiah 29:11* tells us, He has a plan for us to prosper, not harm us. Plans for hope and a future. He will reveal that plan when He is ready. It might not be when we want it, but He will reveal it to you and me. It is our job to be patient and listen to Him to tell us. He knows what we can handle and He gives us a Helper to guide us through that plan.

I will end with this. The author of Hebrews tells us this in *Hebrews 13:3*, "Continue to remember those in prison, as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated, as if you yourselves were suffering." Next time you see someone and want to cast judgement on them, put yourself in their shoes. It is not our position to put that person down for their predicament, but lift them up, as God and Jesus did for us. I might not be the person I should be, but God made me. He loves us unconditionally. That's why He gave Jesus to pay the penalty of sin for us.
