## **Meeting Minutes**

Crime Report: CSO Burger reported 28 vehicle burglaries, 3 residential robberies

- 3) Mayor Kriseman thanked us for being a part of our neighborhood association stating "an association allows at least one loud voice"
- 4) Questions & Answers (DHCAM = DHCA Member; MK= Mayor Kriseman)

**DHCAM:** AARP opened an exercise park. Are there plans to accommodate more for older people in the future for this city?

**MK:** It is important that our plans include all demographics. 20-35yrs and our older demographic is the largest growing in St. Pete.

**DHCAM:** Will there be signature events at the Pier?

**MK:** Collier International will manage The Pier. They have a company for event planning. Details are still being worked.

**DHCAM:** Will there be parking for the disabled at the Pier?

MK: Yes, everything is ADA accessible.

**DHCAM:** Did we make our 2020 goals?

**MK:** Yes, but that is answered in the eye of the beholder. Some do not see it the same way he does.

**DHCAM:** Housing affordability for the future.

**MK:** From all sources, Federal & State. The Sadowski Fund is supposed to go to housing but the government keeps allocating it elsewhere. He asked us to call or contact our senator or councilman to urge them to use the funding for housing. He is working on ordinance & zoning for garage apartments and granny flats. Over a 10 year period he wants to double the amount of housing that is affordable.

**DHCAM:** Blighted houses & commercial properties. What is the plan for those?

**MK:** Property values are rising. Store front conservation on central to preserve the area. When businesses move they open up new ones to revitalize the area.

**DHCAM:** Options for public transportation?

**MK:** Transportation is a big issue. Bad mass transit. Hoping that Pinellas County brings in a transit referendum. The Ferry is a good example of things that work. Also looking into cable-based transit which is 1/5 the cost of light rail with no impact to the level of service on the road. BRT is coming with service between down town & St. Pete beach. The RFP period is ending for Scooters. Expand the trolley & looper.

**DHCAM:** Any advice for me trying to start a Civic group at school?

MK: Set up a meeting with your Principal & present a plan.

**DHCAM:** Downtown is growing. What about the neighborhoods?

**MK:** Want all areas to be successful and thriving. Murals can be in neighborhoods, even using grant money. Encouraging developers to look outside the city into neighborhoods.

**DHCAM:** Stop developing downtown. It is being over saturated. It is not for old-time residents anymore, too expensive.

**MK:** Yes, there are pricey restaurants coming in but also low-cost places. We need to grow smart & bring our footprints up.

**DHCAM:** With the city building up, what is the plan to grow security?

MK: St. Pete is fully staffed and has 600 police officers on the books. Crime is down overall
