Transportation

Transportation, for those over 60, residing and traveling within the County, is available by request for medical appointments, with grocery and other types of trips, as time allows.

National Family Caregiver Support Program

Respite, personal care, financial help with co-pays and medicine, utility bills, and home repair. The recipient of care must be over 60 years of age.

Supportive Services

Paperwork assistance related to Medicare & Medicaid, HEAP and Commodities.

PROVIDED MONTHLY

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

A federal program that provides eligible seniors with a monthly box of shelf-stable items. The box may include juice, cheese, cereal, pasta, peanut butter, canned goods, and more. Pick up on second Tuesdays.

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT: Dennis Bothel, Financial Officer
Dennis Bothel graduated Purdue West Lafayette and worked at Purdue Fort
Wayne two years later. As Dennis moved through the complexity of a educational system with multiple variables — Indiana University, Purdue University,
and Fort Wayne — various career tracks and funding, he was learning how to
build complex budgets. (Little did he know those experiences were preparing
him for budgeting at a nonprofit with multiple funding sources!)

Looking for a new area to practice his expertise, Dennis accepted a position at Ohio University—Chillicothe, serving there for sixteen years before moving on to Southern State Community College where he served in budgeting and academic advising for three years before moving from that system when he served as a part time instructor at Franklin University.

Ready to shift into his third act, Dennis took a job in the Transportation department here at the Center. Dennis observed the activities and methods of funding, and when the position opened he was ready to step into the role of Financial Officer. Eight years later he sees his role here as an expression of all that he learned over the course of his career.

"The budgeting process in higher education is shorter and so is a bit more responsive to economic changes; here at the Center, we have funding that extends from one to five years, but the amounts we receive can change from year-to-year in ways for which we cannot plan. While my career prepared me to deal with funding complexity, it's the social services language that trips me up!" he quips. The Center offers a wide variety of social services for Pickaway Seniors — see pgs 2, 12!

Dennis is married with two, twenty-something children and resides here in Pickaway County.




