

Sunday Reflection: Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles

This Sunday we joyfully celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, two pillars of our Christian faith. Though they came from very different backgrounds, both apostles dedicated their lives to Jesus and helped build the Church we love today. Saint Peter was a humble fisherman named Simon until Jesus called him to leave his nets behind. Jesus gave him a new name, Peter, which means "rock." Even after Peter denied knowing Jesus three times in


a moment of fear, Jesus forgave him and restored him. Peter went on to preach boldly about the Risen Lord, performing miracles and guiding the first Christian communities in Jerusalem and beyond. His simple love and courage remind us that God's mercy can turn our weaknesses into strengths. Saint Paul began as Saul, a man who opposed Jesus and persecuted early Christians. On the road to Damascus, he experienced the light of Christ and heard His voice. This life-changing encounter transformed Paul into a passionate missionary. He traveled thousands of miles, visiting towns and cities, sharing the Gospel with Jews and Gentiles alike. Through letters to the churches he founded, Paul taught about God's love, the power of grace, and the unity we share in Christ.

Both Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome around the year 64 AD, giving their lives rather than denying their faith. Their witness shows us that following Jesus is a journey of trust, humility, and hope. They remind us that no matter our mistakes or past failures, God can use us to bring His love to others. On this feast day, let us ask Saints Peter and Paul to pray for us. May we, like them, be courageous in sharing our faith, generous in forgiving others, and joyful in living the Gospel each day. May their example strengthen our parish as we continue to grow together in Christ.

Saint of the Week ... St. Thomas the Apostle

Thomas was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. When Jesus said he was returning to Judea to visit his sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately exhorted the other Apostles to accompany him on the trip which involved certain danger because of mounting hostility.

At the Last Supper, when Jesus told the disciples that he was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

However, Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas." Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas was gently rebuked for his skepticism and furnished with the evidence he had demanded: the nail marks in his hands and wound in his side.

When the Apostles were dispersed after Pentecost, Thomas was sent to evangelize to the Parthians, Medes, and Persians. He ultimately reached India, preaching the faith to the Malabar coast which still boasts a large native population calling themselves "Christians of St. Thomas." According to tradition, Thomas was killed in an accident when a fowler shot at a peacock and struck Thomas instead. He is the patron saint of India, Pakistan, and architects and construction workers.
