

from the very beginning.

Her students developed and achieved numerous awards, scholarships, competitions (including the famous International Apollo Kids Competition) and have been accepted in the most prestigious colleges such as Julliard, conservatories and many universities as well as movies and television commercials.

Students continue to achieve through the successes of the highly skilled staff. All the teachers have many years of experience in their area of expertise. The love and personal attention that Mrs. L. Elsie Graham was known for still lives on for four generations of musicians.

Mrs. Robinson is a past President of the MuTeOr, the Brooklyn Branch of the National Association of Negro Musician.

MuTeOr is the only branch in the metropolitan area that has members in the youth, collegiate and adult divisions. Today MuTeOr,inc. proudly sponsors the annual Patricia F.
