Brothers and Sisters,

May God's grace give us the necessary joy, peace, and patience to love our neighbors.

John Wesley, the 18th century leader of the Methodist revival, taught a robust and biblically based theology. This theology has three main emphases: 1) Original sin, 2) Saved by grace through faith, and 3) Holiness (both personal & social). Last month (September) we learned about original sin. This month (October) we talk about grace. Next month (November), we'll learn about personal holiness. Then, in December, we'll learn about social holiness. So, let's continue with grace!!



Wouldn't it be wonderful if all the 'wonder' drugs of the world were free? Imagine what health care would be like if all the drugs used to treat AIDs, cancer or mental illness were

free. Of course, that's not reality. The drugs we need to fight serious illnesses cost money and not all of us have enough money to purchase the medication we need. There is, however, one wonder cure that is free. This is wonderful news because this cure is so expensive that none of us could afford it. It is called grace.

Grace is the cure that frees us from sin, the worst ailment ever inflicted on humanity. Remember, sin is any attitude, thought, word, or action that is not loving towards God, neighbor, or self. As stated last month, we all have a sinful nature that causes us to sin. This results in the degradation of society. But the cure is available and free!

The Apostle Paul clearly tells us that we are saved by grace through faith. In Romans 3:21-24, he states, "But now apart from the law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus."

This passage becomes easier to comprehend if we define a few of the words or phrases. So, let's clarify them:

- '...apart from the Law...' For us to be saved through the law, <u>all</u> our attitudes, thoughts, words & actions would have to be loving. So, we must be saved apart from the law.
- '...faith in Jesus...' We trust that Jesus, as fully human and fully God, saves us from our sins. Because we trust Jesus, we want to follow Him.
- '...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God...' We all have a sinful nature.
- '...justified...' Forgiven. It's as if we never sinned. Restores relationship with God.
- '...grace...' God's unconditional love that is made known to us by the Holy Spirit.

Now, re-read Romans 3:21-24 while keeping these definitions in mind.

Grace, God's unconditional love that is made known to us by the Holy Spirit, frees us from both the guilt & power of sin.

It saves us from the guilt of sin by first bringing us to the point of repentance and then offering us forgiveness through faith in Jesus. Repentance is a sincere desire to change from a life of sin to a life characterized by holy love. Once people reach the point of repentance, they realize they cannot change themselves and the only thing they can do is receive God's forgiveness while surrendering to the loving authority of God. God's act of forgiving a repentant sinner is called justifying grace. When a person receives this grace and is justified, that person is no longer condemned because he/she has been forgiven. A right relationship with God is restored. At this point the person is born again or a new creation. (Both terms refer to the same thing.) In this way, God's grace saves us from the guilt of sin.

Once we are freed from the guilt of sin, grace begins the process of freeing us from the power of sin. As we walk in a relationship with the Father through faith in Christ, the Holy Spirit works to change our hearts to make us more holy and loving like Christ. This process of changing our hearts to make us more holy and loving like Christ is called sanctifying grace. As we strengthen our relationship with God through worship, prayer, Bible studies, meditation, fasting and serving others, we open our hearts to God's sanctifying grace. We gain more dominance over our sinful nature and find ourselves becoming the people God created us to be. We find ourselves sinning less and loving more. In this way, grace frees us from the power of sin.

John Newton was a pastor from 18th century England. He experienced God's grace and discovered just how amazing it is. He even wrote a hymn about it. It's called "Amazing Grace".

John Newton experienced justifying grace when he received God's forgiveness in 1748. This occurred right after experiencing a severe storm while aboard a ship. He cried out to God and God saved him and the ship from the storm. At this point, John Newton was saved from the guilt of sin. The Lord put him in a right relationship with God and treated him as if he never sinned. This is remarkable because soon after being saved from the guilt of sin, John became a Captain of a slave ship. He was actively involved in the oppressive slave trade until 1754.

Being saved from the guilt of sin happens in an instant. But being saved from the power of sin is a time-consuming process. This was true for John Newton. Sometime between 1754 and 1788 the Lord convicted him of participating in the evil slave system. Newton repented and became a staunch abolitionist. In 1788, he went public with his anti-slavery views and published "Thoughts Upon the Slave Trade."

One last thing about God's grace. It is offered to everyone, and each person can either accept it or reject it. Have you accepted God's offer of grace? Are you justified? Have you received God's forgiveness through faith in Jesus? Are you opening yourself to God's sanctifying grace so you can become more holy & loving like Jesus? If you answered no to any of these questions, what are you waiting for? It's a gift!

Voting Season

Brothers and Sisters,

May God's grace give us the necessary joy, peace, and patience to love our neighbors.



It is voting season! As your pastor, I will not endorse any political candidate or party. I do not care for whom you vote. That is between you and God. I will, however, encourage you to allow the life and wisdom of Jesus to drive your decision. So, I developed some guidance that may help you to vote in accordance with the life & wisdom of Jesus.

- Do not vote for someone just because a pastor or any other Christian leader told you to vote for that person. Who you vote for is between you and God.
- As fully God & fully human, Jesus is above human politics. Do not demote Him from his Divine status by associating him with a political party or ideology.
- Pray throughout your entire process of deciding for whom to vote.
- Align your vote with Scriptural purpose of government (Psalm 72 and Romans 13:1-7)
 - Protecting people from wrong doers
 - > Criminal justice system that shows no partiality
 - > Common defense through diplomacy & military
 - Develop the circumstances that promote prosperity for all people.
 - > Justice for all people
 - > Protect the weak & vulnerable members of society
 - > Assist the underprivileged
 - > Provide government services
 - > Promote wellbeing of the world through diplomacy & responsible use of military force to foster justice.
- Align your vote with Kingdom of God values (Matthew 5-7)
 - Which candidate's positions most closely conform to the life & wisdom of Jesus?
 - Which candidate best promotes justice by protecting the poor and weak members of society? (Leviticus 19:10, 15, 33, 34, 24:22; Deuteronomy 1:16, 10:18, 15:11, 24:14-15, 17, 19-21, 27:19; Psalm 72:1-20; Isaiah 1:15-17, 58:6-8; Amos 5:11, 12, 14, 15, 24; Micah 6:8 and Luke 1:46-55, 4:16-21, 6:20, 7:22, 12:33, 14:13, 21, 16:19-31)
 - Which candidate best demonstrates love for <u>all</u> people in his/her lifestyle, opinions and political ideology? Which candidate encourages us to love or hate?
- Remember: It is arguably better for a non-Christian whose positions closely conform to the life & wisdom of Christ to win an election than it is for a professing Christian whose positions do not conform to the life & teachings of Christ to win an election.
