SITTING AROUND THE TABLE

"And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with Jesus and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

Matthew 9:10-11 NRSV

If we take a close look at Jesus and who he was and how his mission on earth was accomplished, we notice that Jesus sat around the dinner table a lot. Many of his stories and parables came while sitting around the table with others. It was not only that Jesus shared the table with people, it was with whom Jesus shared the table. Jesus shared the table with a diverse set of people, many who were deemed outcasts of society. He cared and shared the table with people who had broken every rule and were seen as unclean. He dined at the tables of wealthy men whose riches were gained with lies and corruption.

It was radical at the time. No one was that inclusive. The religious do-gooders began to whisper behind his back. They called him a friend of sinners. It was supposed to be an insult, but it never bothered Jesus. He knew this was the right thing to do. He was a friend to everyone. What do friends do? They eat dinner together and share in each other's lives.

Here are a couple other passages where Jesus shared the table.

Matthew 9:10-13:

This passage describes Jesus eating with "tax collectors and sinners" in a house. The Pharisees, who followed strict religious rules, questioned Jesus' decision, highlighting the societal rejection of these groups.

Luke 7:34-35:

This passage refers to Jesus as a "friend of publicans and sinners," further emphasizing his willingness to associate with those considered outcasts.

Strangers eating together and becoming friends, is a simple concept. Yet it is something we are not very good at doing. During the month of June and July, each Monday will provide an opportunity to share a meal with people from our community who may or may not be strangers to us. Sitting at a table and sharing a meal is a sign of acceptance and love. Sharing the table with people we may not know provides an opportunity to learn each other's life stories.

Jesus shared the table with the outcasts and religious leaders for many reasons, but one reason is that he wanted to know their stories. Knowing someone's life story may help to understand their current situation in life. Sharing the table is an act of love and grace. Just a few weeks ago we were given the commandant by Jesus to love one another as I have loved you. One way to show love is to share the table with people - whether we know them well or not at all.

St. John's UCC and the wider United Church of Christ observe an open table during Communion, an open table where the grace of God is granted to all of God's beloved children. Sharing a table with others in our community each Monday in June and July will be an act of communion; sharing love and grace with others.



REMEMBERING



I think most of you have figured out that I have decided to share parts of my life each month, giving you an idea of things that have been significant in my life for that particular month.

So for June, I felt like I had to talk about my dad, since this is the month we celebrate Father's Day. My dad was the son of a Kentucky coal miner. My grandfather was a member of a fraternal organization which had as one of its benefits, the ability for children of deceased fathers to be cared for in a children's home. My grandfather died in his early thirties, which left five children needing care. Circumstances were such that my grandmother was financially unable to provide for the needs of the children. As a result, my dad and three of his siblings, left Kentucky by train, and ended up at the Jr. Order United American Mechanics Children's Home in Tiffin, Ohio. My dad was twelve years old at the time and the other siblings were younger. My dad's older sister was too old to be admitted to the children's home, so she had to be separated from her siblings and remained in the Kentucky/Tennessee area, living with relatives.

I can't imagine what it was like for my grandmother to have to send her children away and for my dad and his siblings to arrive at a strange place that would become their home until they could graduate from high school.

Joshua 1:9 says, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." NIV

Well, God had a plan for all of this. My grandfather had paid dues to the fraternal organization, my grandmother had the strength to make a decision that was best for her children, and my dad and his siblings had the courage to step off the train in Tiffin and begin a new life.

May we all have strength and courage in our lives as we face each new day.



Report from the Northwest Ohio Association Annual Meeting

On Saturday, April 26, I attended the Association Meeting as a delegate representing St. John's, along with Tammy Vajen and Pastor McCarn. Here are my thoughts from the keynote speaker's presentation. The keynote speaker was Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, UCC General Minister and President. We were privileged to have her at our meeting, as she is serving our National Conference, and is in demand for leadership engagements throughout the country. She is the first woman to lead our denomination and has served fourteen years in other roles at the national level.

Dr. Thompson used the theme of the meeting, "Into the Deep", based on Luke 5:4-6 for the basis of her presentation. The verses refer to Jesus telling Simon to go out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch. Questioning Jesus' request, they nonetheless cast out the nets, and they caught such a number of fish that their nets began to break.

She asked us to consider what it means to be "in deep" or "in too deep", as compared to "into the deep". When we are "in deep", we can be in over our heads, seriously involved, or fully committed. When we are "in too deep", we can be in a difficult situation that one cannot get out of no matter how hard you try. Now, look at "into the deep"...it can refer to literally plunging in deep water, plunging into a difficult or unfamiliar situation, or...going on a spiritual journey creating a deeper relationship with God.

Dr. Thomas said the theme, "Into the Deep", is an invitation...an invitation for all of us to enter into an intentional, spiritual journey and dialogue with God. No matter how much you love God, there is always more to learn. The depth of our ability to follow the teachings of Jesus is a reflection of our depth of love of God. Do we dare wade "into the deep" to declare God's love for all? Do we dare wade "into the deep" to allow everyone to worship and experience this community of faith?

As we celebrate 165 years as a faith community this year...what is next for us at St. John's? The future is in our hands and in the hands of those who will carry St. John's forward in to the next 165 years. Be willing to dive "Into the Deep".
