On behalf of the SHORA Board of Directors and Executives, I would like to kick off 2019 by thanking community members, SHORA sponsors, and the City /Provincial partners for your continued support and patronage to our community. 2018 was another successful year for our association, both in terms of activity and membership. SHORA, with the support of your neighbors, established a Little Free Library in Laughton Heights Park, and our Directors organized a number of events including a Street Social which drew hundreds of neighbors together for a memorable afternoon. We are also being told that the Brentano exit from our neighborhoods will remain open into Contract 2 (2022).

On a personal note, I would also like to thank Ryan Enright for his leadership and community spirit, Ryan is acting as Past President this year and remains active in our association. It is an honour and a privilege for me to be associated with our wonderful community association and the good work it does!

LITTLE FREE LIBRARY

A Little Free Library is a "take a book, return a book" free book exchange. They come in many shapes and sizes, the most common version is a small wooden "house" of books. Anyone may take a book to read or bring a book to share.

SHORA was excited to be able to launch a pilot project with the City of Mississauga to build and install a "Little Free Library" (LFL) in Laughton Heights Park this past summer. While these lending libraries are popular globally and there are many on private property in Peel, this is the





first of it's kind in a public park space in Mississauga.

On August 23rd, SHORA welcomed community members and local politicians to open our LFL. Dozens of residents and friends of Sherway came out, each adding their own book to fill our Library for the first time. Since then, it has been delightful to see a constantly rotating stock of books for both young and old fill its shelves.

SHORA would like to thank Bill Lawless, a Sherway community member, for his endless hours of work in helping to design and build our Little Free Library. We would not have this incredible addition to our neighbourhood without his building talents. Also, next time you check out the LFL, be sure to look at the beautiful wood burning on top of the Middle Road Bridge, done by Bill's 15 year old granddaughter!



LAUGHTON HEIGHTS RINK UPDATE

Mother Nature so far in December 2018 and January 2019 has been really good for minimal driveway shoveling, but it's been terrible for rink building! No snow and temperatures on the plus side have made it impossible so far to have an outdoor rink at Laughton Heights Park.

So let's change it up and go through how, exactly a natural ice rink is built! There are 3 things needed to get it up and going once the City installs the square boards and shed:

- 1. **Volunteers**. There are 5 dedicated ice rink volunteers in Sherway. The rink needs lots of labour in the early stages when being built, and then needs constant attention, usually twice on weekdays for scraping & flooding, and more than that on weekends and days with snow showers (snow has to be cleared quick or it can ruin the ice). Special mention and thanks goes to the Morren family, who gives a substantial amount of daily effort towards the rink every year!
- 2. **Snow**. The natural rink needs enough snow from mother nature to be tamped/stepped/packed down into a "floor" that sits on top of the park grass. The snow layer prevents water from leaking when applied, and it takes the place of an expensive waterproof tarp that some people use in their own backyard rinks. Cold weather matters, but the process can't start until there is enough snow.
- 3. Water. Yes of course! Water is applied each time the rink is flooded, and depending on how cold it is, the amount of water applied can vary. Applying too much water can actually create huge problems, so less is more. Early in the season when the rink is being built up, the rink can see a thin flood every 2 to 3 hours if the temperatures are cold enough. The initial building can take at least 3+days and ideally -10C makes it easier on the rink volunteers. When the rink is established and being used, the shovels are always used to clear the surface before flooding, and maintenance tends to be done towards the end of the day. The rink shovels are always available and everyone is encouraged to clear the ice as often as possible.

So that's what goes on behind the scenes! Depending on the weather and timing this year, you may be able to see this process unfold at the park while you read this. Fingers crossed, and I hope to see you there!

Happy new year. Here's hoping that any unfortunate break-ins and safety-related incidents in our neighborhood take a holiday.

Ultimately, we all know that this is one of the safer neighborhoods in Mississauga according to the police, although we experienced what seems like heightened activities this past year. This may be in part to the fact that in recent months our Sherway Facebook Group has been very active with our residents reporting incidents of car break ins and even coyote sightings. However, as important as it is to let neighbours know about anything you see, it is also important that we report any incidents or suspicious activity to the police. Meanwhile, all experts point to prevention as the best way to avoid incidents. Keep your car doors and homes locked, bright light sensors are great, look at the ease of your property's access and close any gaps, and secure your windows. In the colder weather, criminals are on the streets looking for cars being warmed up. It takes less than 6 seconds to steal a car and those cars can be used in other crimes. Newer model cars need less than thirty seconds to warm up on cold days, so if it's running, make sure its locked!

Let's keep our Neighborhood Watch going by keeping an eye on what's going and on and continuing to report it.

Wood Clean Up

Sherway homeowners had the opportunity to control pests by disposing of wood from their properties into dumpsters in Sept 2018. This initiative was a great success with two bins full of various wood being hauled away from our community.

Coyotes

Enjoying our neighbourhood also may result in encounters with local wildlife such as coyotes. Always ensure pets are controlled and report any aggressive, sick, or injured coyotes to the City of Mississauga's Animal Services at (905) 896-5858.

Tree Storm Response

During a storm (rain, winter, ice storm etc) event, Forestry staff respond to downed tree calls from residents and emergency services. All calls are prioritized. Top priorities are trees that are blocking main arterial roads or have fallen on buildings

Electrical hazards such as trees on electrical wires, should be reported to Enersource.

Broken branches or trees down in parks etc. are dealt with after all priority calls have been resolved.

To report storm damaged trees please call 3-1-1 (or 905-615-4311 if outside of City limits).

For emergencies after regular business hours call 905-615-3000.
