The other day, Charlemagne and I did our annual tour of cemeteries and looked and remembered people. It is hard to come to the realization that there are entire rows of people we knew who are now dead and buried. Are we that old? Has it been that long ago? What would we say to them if they were still with us today?

One man that comes into our lives on a regular basis always says, "God bless." I think he really means it and does not say it lightly. I want to reply to him, but he always is gone so quickly that I cannot get a reply out fast enough to tell him how much that means to my husband and me.

I want to tell him that we care and love him but, like a shooting star, he is gone. That is like many of the people in the cemeteries: they have not necessarily done great works but, instead, held our hands, smiled, written cards, or, best of all, understood when we were hurting.

Onkel Doktor Moershel (Dr. Henry G. Moershel) once remarked of someone that he could and would "lead his sheep." Truly, I never thought of a human doing that, only Jesus, yet, in the Bible, Jesus is very specific when He makes that command about going forth and leading his sheep.

Looking at the gravestones, I think of those Sunday school teachers, song leaders and elders who led, but I also look at those who served behind the scenes and helped – the unsung heroes. The ones that God has blessed us with. They may be dead and now waiting for us in Heaven, but we remember them still and the deeds of love that they gave us.

Wendy Sauter/ 1709 4th Ave South Amana/ HP-R / HP GRANT APPLICATION - Replace existing three double hung colonial style windows with Amana compliant 9 over 6 Wooden windows 59 3/4" high by 29 1/2" wide. Located on the first-floor southeast corner of residence. Work is done and has been inspected and photographed by the Administrator. Have a copy of material and labor receipt. \$2,644.00 x 0.75 = \$1983. Need BOT approval of check.
- b. 2024-028. Bill Albert/ 215 53rd East Amana/ HP-R / New siding on north face of house. New siding will be light gray to match existing house color. NOTE: Changing to 4" vinyl siding color and look must match existing siding.
- c. 2024-033. ASI Meat Shop / 4513 F St Amana / HP-C / Cover siding with metal from roofs that were replaced. There are holes in the wooden siding now and birds get in. Open question - should the storage container next to the building be painted to match surrounding Amana Historical buildings?
- d. 2024-035. Glenn and Mary Goetz / 5208 C St East Amana / HP-R / Replace the K style gutters and downspouts on the garage with new K style gutters and downspouts. Color light gray to match siding. Garage is a non-historic concrete block with cedar siding. Gutters on the sides, downspouts on the back.
- e. 2024-036. Lyndsey and Ryan McCarty / 2605 J St Middle Amana / HP-R / 1) Replace a 1990s pool and wooden deck with a new 40" x 25' concrete patio. There will be a 90' long retaining wall associated with the patio. A 5' wide x 27' long sidewalk will extend to the north of the new patio. 2) Replace wooden fence and gate (fell over in 2023) with new 7' tall cedar privacy fence. HPC CONDITIONS: No pool means that a privacy fence is not approved - must be Amana Style fence.
- f. 2024-039. Chocolate Haus-Dan and Elizabeth Wood / 4521 220th Trail Amana / HP-C / Replace 90 vertical spindles on the side of the deck. Make horizontal Amana compliant railings around complete circumference of deck and steps. HPC CON-DITIONS: No caps on bottom posts, and always see ACLUD for a permit before work starts.
- g. 2024-040. Robert Kruse-agent Jon Childers / 2504 J St Middle Amana / HP-R / Replace existing wooden deck using cedar tone treated lumber. Eliminate privacy fence. Railing -two board Amana compliant style. Reduce south portion of deck steps to only three feet and reduce width of stairs to 36". Will use 5" deck boards, 4 x 4 posts, 2 x 4 rails and a 2 x 6 railing cap on top. VI. Other Business.
