Presiding Commissioner, Kyle Carroll, West District Commissioner, Kyle White, East District Commissioner, Garry McFee and County Clerk, Melissa Meek.

Presiding Commissioner, Kyle Carroll, West District Commissioner, Kyle White and East District Commissioner, Garry McFee welcomed those in attendance with Kyle Carroll leading the group in prayer followed by the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk, Melissa Meek advised revenues were down for motor vehicle fees.

Presiding Commission, Kyle Carroll updated the Commission on the DDRJ (DeKalb Daviess Regional Jail) and the board bill associated with the jail.

The Commission granted a patron in Grant Township an extension on brush removal.

County Clerk, Melissa Meek discussed the remaining elections for 2020 and grant monies she would be receiving to help with keeping her precincts sanitized and disinfected. Melissa stated she doesn't feel as though she will spend it all and noted that any funds that remain will be returned to the state.

Road & Bridge Supervisor, Bill Gray discussed roads, terraces and asked to be able to get a bid on equipment needed for their department.

The Commission discussed COVID-19. As of April 28, 2020 The Courthouse will remain on restricted access until May 4, 2020 when staffing will return to normal. Guidelines for the Courts remain in effect until May 15. Patrons entering the building will follow the guidelines of the 43rd Circuit Judge Brent Elliott which includes signing in and answering a questionnaire before being allowed to enter the building. The Commission continues to thank all of the patrons in the County for their patience and understanding during this unprecedented event that has affected our entire nation.
