
INTRODUCTION


FIRST READING: Ezekiel 37:12-14

Marlys Joyce Helgeland (née Skarin), age 92, passed away peacefully on March 21, 2025, in Bothell, Washington. A devoted mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and friend, Marlys lived a life rooted in faith, service, and love for her family and community.

Born on March 2, 1933, in Minneapolis, Minnesota to Sigurd and Alice Skarin. She was the beloved little sister to older sister, Meredith. As a young teen, Marlys moved to Seattle. She graduated from Queen Anne High School, class of 1950. She later pursued her passion for education at Seattle University with the goal of becoming a teacher.

Marlys began her professional journey after

her youngest daughter started kindergarten. Her career in education support began on the playground at Woodin Elementary. She later served as school secretary at Shelton View Elementary and Cottage Lake Elementary before concluding her career at Bear Creek Elementary. Her warmth and dedication left a lasting impression on students and staff alike. A woman of deep faith, Marlys joined First Lutheran Church in Bothell in 1961 and remained an active member throughout her life. She found joy in singing with the PraiSing and sanctuary choirs. Her creative spirit shone through her work with the Altar Guild, where she lovingly arranged flowers for services. She also poured her talents into quilting—creating beautiful pieces for family members and fundraising efforts to support the church youth group.

Marlys was deeply involved in her daughters' lives and their communities. She served as PTA president at their elementary school and was honored with the Golden Acorn Award for her outstanding volunteerism. She chaperoned countless trips with Northshore Ski School and was a



familiar face at swim meets—always ready to lend a hand or cheer from the sidelines.

Her greatest joy came from being with her family. Marlys was a constant presence at birthdays, concerts, games, and every milestone worth celebrating. Her daughters—Cathy Wilson (Greg), Jean Elledge (Brad), and Linda Donaldson (Bud)—were the center of her world. Her love extended to her grandchildren and great-grandchildren, each of whom felt the warmth of Nana's unwavering support.

Marlys was preceded in death by her husband Richard Helgeland; her parents Sigurd Skarin and Alice (Skarin) DeYonnes; her sister Meredith Kaechele; and granddaughter-in-law Megan Feldmar Wilson.

Marlys Joyce Helgeland will be remembered as a woman of grace who gave generously of herself—to her family, church, schools, and community. May her memory bring comfort to all who knew and loved her.
