It's Love at First Bite with Mini Cherry Cheesecakes

Just like a full-size cheesecake, these bite-sized treats are packed with creamy flavor and are a perfect way to treat your Valentine to a special dessert!

INGREDIENTS

For the crust:

- ½ cup unsalted butter
- 1 ¼ cup graham cracker crumbs (about 9 full-size crackers)
- ¼ cup granulated sugar

For the cheesecake:

- 2 large eggs
- 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 21 ounce can of cherry pie filling

INSTRUCTIONS

Make graham cracker crust by melting butter and using a fork to mix in the graham crumbs and ¼ cup sugar. Set aside.

Beat 1 cup sugar, eggs, cream cheese, and vanilla until well blended. Press 1-2 tsp crust in a paper-lined mini muffin pan. Fill ⅔ full with cream cheese filling.

Bake in a 350-degree oven for about 17-20 minutes. Makes about 4 dozen mini cherry cheesecakes. Store tightly covered in the refrigerator.

To serve, top each cheesecake with a tablespoon of cherry pie filling (try to get one cherry on each pie). Enjoy cold!
